Happy New Year!

Happy New Year! As you read this greeting you may be wondering if I just skipped over December, Advent and Christmas and have gone right to January 1, 2014. Happy New Year is not a greeting we hear as we enter the month of December. Yet, it is appropriate as Advent is the beginning of the Church Year with its seasons of Advent, Epiphany, Lent, Easter, and long season of Pentecost. They are seasons that mark the rhythm of our faith journey throughout the year, beginning in Advent with our preparation to celebrate the birth of Jesus.

Advent is the season of 24 days, including 4 Sundays of preparation and anticipation prior to Christmas, which this year begins December 1st. The word "advent" means "coming' or "appearing" and for the Church it means the "coming or appearing of Jesus." Or, another way of saying it is—Advent is the season in which we anticipate a fresh, new appearing of Jesus whose birth is the "good news of great joy." And, this

great joy is that Immanuel, "God with us" has come to us. Advent not only affirms this great truth, it is also a season that asks the question: Do we take time to notice God's coming especially in these days that get filled with all kinds of activities of the season?

When we stop to think about where Jesus first came, where he was born...in a stable



and placed in a manger...isn't that such an ordinary place for God to make an appearance? When I reflect on this, I am glad that God comes to the ordinary, everyday places of life because that is where I live. As you may have wondered if I jumped over December right to January in the opening greeting, I

wonder if we may jump over Advent right to Christmas thinking that Christmas is really what this time of the year is all about. Some of our hurried activity can push us that way as we move through the rushing crowds and the demands of all the preparations in which we are involved. Perhaps what we need, in the midst of all that, is a daily advent, a daily awareness of Jesus so that when Christmas arrives we are not just looking with anticipation but celebrating what we have already experienced--- that God is with us because God has been with us and we have already experienced that in the ordinary, everyday places preceding Christmas.

One of my favorite books to read during the Advent season is a book of poetry by Ann Weems entitled "Kneeling in Bethlehem." One of her poems is "The Coming of God." Here are a few lines...

Our God is the One who comes to us in a burning bush, in an angel's song, in a newborn child. Our God is the One who cannot be found locked in the church, not even in the sanctuary.

Our God will be where God will be with no constraints, no predictability.

Our God will be born where God will be born. When God is ready God will come.

Watch...for you know not when God comes.

Watch that you might be found whenever, wherever God comes.

What are some places,

God might encounter us in a burning bush or an angel's song in our daily living in this season of Advent? Might it be in the smile of a child, a song on the radio, a quiet moment of prayer, a phone call from a friend, joy in finding that perfect gift for someone, the warm glow of a candle reminding us of God's light and a peaceful moment in the midst of a hectic day? Last Advent I saw a bird at the feeder I did not recognize. As I turned to get my camera, the bird flew away. So I stood at the window, camera in hand, waiting and hoping for the bird to return. It did not. However, I said to myself that I would keep waiting and watching. Tomorrow the bird may return. For me this was a spiritual epiphany, a reminder that, like the bird, God will show up. That night in my journal I wrote "The Advent season are days of waiting, not passively but with anticipation to see where Jesus will appear in my daily living." In an email to a friend that day, I ended with these word "May your Advent season be filled with Christ-sightings." May the greeting of "Happy New Year" set in place a spiritual rhythm for this Advent season of watching with fresh anticipation for new ways in which God will be found "whenever and wherever."



Bible Studies

Adult Study—Wednesday evenings

On Wednesday night at 6:45 p.m. Pastor Bob will be leading us as we explore the Bible through a video series entitled "That The World May Know" with biblical teacher and historian Ray Vander Laan who is an ordained minister with the Christian Reformed Church and has completed graduate studies in Jewish Studies in the U.S. Israel, Turkey and Egypt. His



teaching focuses on understanding the Bible by guiding people through the land, culture and historical context of Scripture. Filmed on location in the Middle East, we will see and hear the significance of biblical stories in the life of God's people then and now and how they call us to faith. The first 5 weeks will help us discover why God guided his people to the particular land known as the Promised Land as we go to 4 Tells (the word for archeological city sites) and the Jordan River. After each video presentation, we will have the opportunity to discuss its significance for the people of God then and now.


