INTERIM PASTOR'S REPORT

As the title of this report indicates, I have had the honor of being your interim pastor for the past four months, which has been a positive experience for me. Four months is not a long time, but it is enough time to know that Libertyville Covenant Church is a congregation of loving, generous and God-centered people. Judy and I have greatly appreciated your welcoming us into the life of the congregation and, personally, into your lives.

In writing to the church in Ephesus, the Apostle Paul prays for the church in this manner: I pray that out of his glorious riches he may strengthen you with power through his Spirit in your inner being, so that Christ may dwell in your hearts through faith. And I pray that you, being rooted and established in love, may have power, together with all the Lord's holy people, to grasp how wide and long and high and deep is the love of Christ, and to know this love that surpasses knowledge—that you may be filled to the measure of all the fullness of God. (Ephesians 3:16-19) In this time of transition between pastors, this is a prayer that I hold for you—to have the strength of Christ in being the church together in your continuing and growing ministry rooted in the extravagant love of Christ. It is being "rooted" in Christ that we have focused on, beginning in September. Our worship themes have been "Rooted in the Word, Christ and Worship," Entering 2014 we continued the "rooted" theme with "Rooted in Prayer," and through the Lenten season we will continue with "Rooted in Joy" and "Rooted in Grace."

As an emphasis in worship, we engaged in seven Sundays which focused on the ministries of the congregation as each ministry highlighted their service both within and outside the church. The culminating event was letting the Word, heard in worship, move us to an act of expressing our faith in service with 115 people moving from worship to packing food pouches at Feed My Starving Children. What a powerful expression of the church in ministry!

I have had the opportunity of leading an adult Bible study on Wednesday evening which has generated good discussion with a video series called "That the World May Know." It is a series filmed in the Holy Land and takes us to the physical locations that coincide with the biblical text. This study will continue during the season of the Wednesday Church Family Nights. Speaking of Wednesday nights, it has been inspiring to see how so many people have invested themselves in meal preparation and serving, and in staffing the various activities.

Church membership increased by 2 members in 2013, as the Deacon Report indicates. This increase is reflected with 6 members received, 2 members transferred and 2 members withdrawing. I mention this to note that there will be a new members' class on February 23rd. If someone is interested in exploring this opportunity, please talk with me.

This time of transition is a time to celebrate what has been, how God has provided, and

how the congregation is working together. It is also a time for continued self assessment with asking the questions that help in understanding the direction in which God continues to call the church forward. There is a West African word, Sankofa, which means "looking back to move ahead." That is a good word for transitioning as this is a time to both look at where the congregation has been and at what the congregation is now learning about itself that gives insights in shaping the future. I see some evidence of this and I want to encourage the congregation to continue to be intentional in its moving forward.

In closing, I express my thanks to the Council for helping me with my orientation and for their dedication to their particular ministries. I thank Maria and Brian for their dedication to their ministries of mentoring the children and youth of the congregation and their parents. To the music team, Kris Nikkel as choir director and the choir, Eric Sawyer and the worship team, Linda Krueger at the organ and Linda Baumann at the piano, who concluded her ministry in December, I say thank you for helping to lead us in worship. Thank you Dan and Ron for keeping the building in good order and for doing that with a smile. Thank you Ann for giving the young children a safe, loving place to be while their parents are in Sunday School and worship. I express my thanks to Marti, who is not only the church secretary but the person who has been indispensible, on a daily basis, with helping me to know what I need to know and where I need to be. Marti is not only the church secretary and helpful to me, she is also the one I would call "the vice-president of first impressions" as she gives a wonderful and positive impression of the church to everyone who comes into the office. To my wife, Judy, I express my thanks for her support, insight and encouragement in this new chapter of interim ministry in our "retirement." Both of us are grateful for this opportunity to be with you. We know that God has led us here for this time. We trust that you are receiving us as much from us as we are receiving from you.

Speaking of God's leading, I pray for God's leading in your search for a permanent pastor. God's Word reminds as that as we "trust in the Lord with all our heart and lean not on our own understanding and in all your ways acknowledge him, he will direct your path." So, we actively and prayerfully wait to see where this directing of God will lead. Judy and I look forward to the next months and, again, we thank you for welcoming us into the life of Libertyville Covenant Church.

ASSOCIATE PASTOR'S REPORT

It was at the end of the summer of 2003 and I was working as a roofer to raise funds for seminary and to stay near Maria during our engagement. I had just carried my last bundle of shingles up to the roof when I received a call from Libertyville Covenant Church asking if I would be interested in being the interim youth pastor. It's hard to believe that was ten years ago! 2013 has been one of the most transformative years of ministry that I have had and I am grateful for all that God has done in our church during this past year. Here is a snap shot.

Retreat: As many of you know, leading retreats is an important part of my call to ministry. In 2013 I went on or led seven retreats from middle school/high School fall and winter retreats, to youth pastor retreats, summer leadership trips and the church family retreat. I love the time away and the space that is created for God to meet with each of us! A special thanks to the Lundstedt's for letting us use their lake house for many of those retreats this past year! What a blessing it is to have space like that.

Intern: Brad Rosengren stepped in as youth ministry intern at One Life 2013. He has jumped in and done a great job connecting with students, leading authentically and creating an inviting and warm place for students each week. I am grateful for him and his leadership over this past year and am excited to see how God continues to develop him as a leader and pastor.

Leaders: This year we had a great group of leaders investing in the lives of students. From our faithful and ever present Dave and Darilyn Anderson, and Becca Rosengren working with our High School students, to student leaders Rachel McLinden, Cindy LaPradd, Dave Truskowski, Kirsten Reid, and Sarah Blackwell, to our new leaders Brad and Meghan DeJong who have stepped in to lead our junior high ministry on Wednesday nights. A special thanks to Chris and Twyla Becker who came on the summer trip and demonstrated service, organization, and camping experience!

Sticky Faith: This has been a year of "Sticky Faith" for LCC. I along with a great team made two trips to Pasadena to partake in what is known as the "Sticky Faith Insider Cohort". We were challenged, equipped and encouraged by our time in Pasadena and have worked diligently over the past year to develop the following values in our church; Grace based gospel, intergenerational relationships and partnership with parents. One of the biggest elements of "Sticky Faith" to affect our church was the Sticky Buddy initiative. Thanks to the space on the church family retreat in August we did a soft launch of this initiative with great success. At this point at least 90% of our students have adults in the church that are praying for them and looking to find ways to invest in their live. We are continuing to work on developing "God First thinking" in our church as the next step of "Sticky Faith."

Summer Trip: We listened for a long time about the best way to go deeper in faith this summer with students and adults. I prayed about and wondered if this was a year to do a mission trip. I felt like a mission trip never gained traction but what did gain traction was a remake of a discipleship trip I created two years earlier. The result was a discipleship trip to South Dakota with the simple intent of helping young people develop deep roots of faith. This was a fantastic trip and it also included five students from our Mexican Sister church! This was a tremendous learning opportunity for everyone involved and a great next step in the development of our relationship with our sister church.

Change: With Dwight and Kathy leaving we have all had to re-shift some of our focus to new areas to cover the vacancies left by their departure. This was also a new season for us to try new things, develop and clarify our identity as a church and focus on what it means to be a rooted church. I enjoyed the challenge of preaching more often and leading in different capacities around the church. One person said when reflecting on the change in the church..."I thought it was going to feel like a time of transition when in reality it feels much more like a new beginning." We continue to develop this idea of being rooted this year as we prepare for the new beginnings with a lead pastor. Many thanks goes to Pastor Bob for coming in and helping us listen better and prepare ourselves for the new season ahead.

CHILDREN'S MINISTRY REPORT

In 2013 we focused a lot of our time and energy on Sticky Faith and understanding what Sticky Faith looks like in our children's ministry, in our homes and in the larger church. Throughout the year we had great conversations, started some new programs and made changes to existing programs. There is still much progress to be made but it is wonderful to see some of our Sticky Faith initiatives flourish. I am always filled with joy on Sunday mornings as I witness adults taking time to spend a few minutes catching up with their young sticky buddies. We pray that these relationships will bear much fruit in the lives of our children and the adults taking the time to invest. As we look ahead to 2014 we hope to continue working on our Sticky Faith initiative by turning our attention to how we can better equip parents and on revisioning our summer ministry opportunities for children and families. Keep your eyes open because new opportunities will be coming your way!

Sunday School and Kids Club: We continue to enjoy using the Orange curriculum for both our Sunday School and Kids Club programs. This allows us to have the same Bible story and themes for both Sunday and Wednesday programming. The continuity helps kids really grasp the ideas and concepts we are wrestling with and allows us extra time to focus on four "faith skills." Our Sunday School classes work on God Sightings (learning to see God at work in their life and the world around them) and prayer, while our kids club classes focus on understanding how to use the Bible and scripture memory. Both Sunday morning and Wednesday evening programs have experienced great energy this year and our Wednesday night kids club groups are growing by leaps and bounds. Many nights we are stretching the limit of what our space can handle! It is a wonderful blessing to be able to welcome friends and neighbors to our classes on Wednesday evenings.

Children's Church: In May we concluded our year of learning about worship with the children leading the Mother's Day worship service. This was truly one of my favorite moments of children's ministry this year. It was such a blessing to see the kids read scripture, serve as ushers, lead in prayer, offer special music and sing and play the chimes with all their might! Preparing for this experience was a wonderful way for us to review all that we had learned about the different pieces of the worship service. The loving and supportive response from the congregation helped our children feel that our worship service is a place where they belong and are welcomed. During the summer we focused on a short series called "Soul Shift" and had some great conversations on how God can change our hearts and our minds. In September we began our three year rotation anew and are now journeying our way through the Old Testament.

Preschool VBS: In June we had a great week of preschool VBS as we headed to the ranch for a roundup. Each day we journeyed the trail to learn more about the life of Moses. We had 38 preschoolers attend VBS. In addition to our regular preschool crew we had preschoolers who are a part of our Mom to Mom group attend, a group from Redeemer Life Covenant Church attend, and quite a few grandchildren of LCC members join us for a fun week.

Summer Adventures: We had three summer adventures for grade school kids this summer, a craft adventure, two cooking classes and a game/water day. Between the three adventures we had a total attendance of 84 kids. Summer Adventures are a fun way for us to stay connected to kids during the summer and allows LCC kids an opportunity to invite friends.

Family Retreat: We enjoyed a wonderful weekend at Conference Point Center in Williams Bay, WI, for our annual family retreat. 76 people from 23 different families joined us this year as we explored the theme of "Sticky." The retreat was a wonderful time of relationship building and was a great springboard for our Sticky Buddies initiative.

Special Events: Throughout the year we had opportunities to gather together as a young families group for special events such as the Ash Wednesday family night, interactive Last Supper, end of year kids club party, summer Wednesdays on the hill, night of service, and family Advent night.

We continue to have a core group of approximately 40 volunteers to cover nursery care throughout the year. The Council has accepted the following statements as a first edition revision of our current Mission and vision statement, we plan to continue to revise and edit this in 2014.

Proposed Mission Statement: As a community of real people with real issues who believe that Jesus came to save the lost and bring new life; we worship, pray, share our faith, study and give together.

Proposed Vision Statement: We look to God's word for guidance and rely on the Holy Spirit for power to live out our call to serve our community with a transforming message that inspires and draws people closer to an intensely personal God who loves and invites us to live in rhythm with Him!

Our core commitments include:

- 1. Worshiping our Lord and God with blended and unified reverence.
- 2. Developing relationships that are centered in Jesus Christ.
- 3. Pursuing a Biblical witness that includes compassion, mercy and justice.
- 4. Instruction and nurture rooted in the Word of God.
- 5. Integrated Christian Formation for children, youth and adults.
- 6. Articulating, teaching, advocating and modeling a lifestyle that is inconvenienced for the sake of the Gospel.
- 7. Witnessing to a contagious view of the Gospel.

CHRISTIAN FORMATION REPORT

It's been several years since we changed the name of the *Christian Education* Committee to the *Christian Formation* Committee. I know that after calling it one thing for so long it's tough to change – I know it is for me. I still get mail addressed to the Christian Educations Chair. Many LCC members still refer to it as the Christian Education Committee. Even after a year of chairing the committee, I'll call it Christian Education. I know it doesn't seem like much of a change for most, especially because one of the major parts of this committee's charge is to facilitate adult Sunday School and to coordinate with Children's Ministry and Youth Ministry. However, I feel like it has become so much more. When the churches learn together something beyond knowledge acquisition takes place. We grow and transform – striving to be people that seek God's heart and be a church that carries out His will.

Adult Sunday School

Paul Nauman continued with his leadership role in Adult Sunday School throughout the past year. In September, we were blessed to have Ken Greenfield come on board to help facilitate and lead. They, along with teacher/facilitators Steve Pointer, Steve Hall, Jay Phelan and Caren Vollrath brought us through some great studies and even better conversations. It has been these conversations that have been the lifeblood of Adult Sunday School and a key facet in strengthening our churches fellowship.

Sticky Faith

Over the past year, our Sticky Faith initiative as grown into something great. With the overall goal of making THE faith and interaction in the church "stick" to our children throughout their lives we seek to engage families in different and meaningful ways. Our team of Pastor Brian and Maria Zahasky, Paul Nauman, Caren Vollrath and Dave Anderson have helped guide LCC on this journey of strengthening our church family by focusing on the lives of our children by connecting each one of them to an adult outside of their immediate family, or *Sticky Buddy*. Parenting is rewarding, yet tough job. It's becoming more and more difficult for parents to have a perfect grasp on every facet of their child, or children's, lives. Through Sticky Faith we are sharing in the lives of families to help make sure The Church is a solid support for parents and kids alike.

Bible Studies and Small Groups

The teaching ministry of the church includes a number of Bible studies and small groups. These groups provide solid teaching of the Word of God and truly are involved in the formation of our lives in Christ. Each group has a leader or leadership team that gives direction to the studies. In addition to solid Bible teaching they provide an element of group care for those who attend. We are always interested in beginning new groups as interest is expressed and leaders identified.

MOM to MOM: Two active Mom to Mom groups meet twice a month and provide a setting of love, affirmation and teaching for mothers of young children. Many of those who attend are not members of our church. While the moms are studying together upstairs, their children are involved in an excellent Bible learning program downstairs. This has been a very positive Outreach for our church this year. Larissa Greenfield coor-

dinated this ministry. The Friday morning section is led by Caren Vollrath and Karin Lundstedt. The Wednesday evening section of the Mom to Mom continues to be led by Carol Dieball and Twyla Becker. Karin Anderson coordinates a large group of childcare volunteers. Kathy Nelson coordinated the children's program the first part of the year and since September Ann Frost has taken over this important role.

Small group Bible studies: Groups meeting this year included:

- Men's Study This group is held on Friday mornings, led by Chris Becker, which follows different studies and guides throughout the year.
- Women's Study This group is held on Thursday mornings and is studying the books of James and Proverbs
- Wednesday Evening Study This group is led by Pastor Bob using the video series on "That the World May Know" and following each video presentation discussing the significance for the people of God then and now.
- Where is It Written This group meets every-other Friday night and is facilitated by Ken Greenfield and Joel Dillon. Discussions about pressing social and spiritual topics stem from exactly what scripture says about the matters.

Young Families Small Group: This fall we continued our small group for families with children fifth grade and younger. Teresa and Scott Anderson lead and host this group at their home the second and fourth Sundays of each month. The time together begins with a family devotion filled with interactive activities for kids of all ages followed by a time for adults to share prayer requests and pray together. The evening is concluded with a potluck dinner.

During this time of transition, it has been great to see that our church is not just standing still and waiting. We are working hard to make a difference in each other's lives and there is no place that is more evident than how we interact in times of Christian Formation. To that end, I would like to thank Ann Frost, Maria Zahasky and Pastor Brian for their energy and excitement for the children and youth of the church. Also, thanks to the Sticky Faith team for all they are doing to strengthen the faith of not just our children, but the entire family. Likewise, thank you to the leaders of the small groups. It is often tough to make the time not only to attend, but to lead these groups. We thank you for your contributions to LCC. Lastly, thanks to the Christian Formation committee of Pastor Brian, Maria Zahasky, Ken Greenfield, Ann Frost and Paul Nauman for all of their work over the past year. We are excited to see what 2014 has in store.

LONG RANGE PLANNING COMMITTEE

In 2013, led by the Long Range Planning team, (sometimes known as the "Vitality Team"), Libertyville Covenant Church (LCC) continued to be involved in a denomination sponsored initiative called "Congregational Vitality". Vitality is about thriving, growing, and depending on God to lead us deeper in Christ and further in mission.

With the help of Covenant leadership, LCC has used several tools to seek out ways of growing as a "missional church". This includes a program called *Veritas* that explores where we are, and where we want to be. We have used surveys and workshops open to everyone to discover our strengths and areas of improvement. These steps toward building "vitality" included the ECCs aid in development of our "Covenant for Community Life" (our behavioral covenant); a *Veritas* workshop; and a survey of church health called *PULSE*.

Through Veritas, we've learned the four types are: Health/Missional, Stable, Critical Moment, and At-Risk. Through the Veritas workshop, and based upon the Pulse Survey, the consensus is that LCC is generally stable, but trending towards "Critical Moment" status. Our goal of course is for LCC to become a healthy & missional church and by "healthy" we mean pursing Christ; by "missional" we mean pursuing Christ's priorities in the world.

In the fall of 2012, LCC took part in a congregational survey called PULSE. PULSE is a survey which diagnoses the vitality of a church using Ten Healthy Missional markers (or constructs), and a number of other factors. One of the goals of PULSE is to stimulate conversation around key issues, not to solve every problem confronting our church. The answers are not in the data, the answers are in the conversations that the leadership and the congregation have regarding this data.

In April, 2013, key elements of the PULSE survey were shared with congregation, starting with a "kick-off" in the adult Sunday School program. After initial training from Peter Sjoblom, (from our Central Conference Office), on leading small group discussions, a series of home based discussions were held. In late April, May and early June, about 85 members attending at least one of these sessions. At these sessions, discussion focused on our LCC church life and reflections upon what the PLUSE survey scores indicate. Notes from these discussions were consolidated, (at least a bit), and shared with the church council and the pastoral search committee. Based on the very positive feedback received from participants/members regarding these home based discussions, we envision more "home" events in the future. We expect to take the next step in our "Vitality" journey in the spring of 2014, and we're looking forward to the opportunity to dialogue with you more fully as together we seek God's Kingdom here in Lake County!

OUTREACH COMMITTEE

The following have served as members of our committee for some of this year: Christy Albers, Tim Albers, Susan Barg, Pastor Brian Zahasky, Pastor Dwight Nelson, David Enquist, Mary Gianaras, Jill Heath, Loren Lindholm, Tricia Sorensen and Benjamin Stephens. This list has changed significantly during the course of the year and members of the committee at this writing are; Christy Albers, Tim Albers, Pastor Brian, David Enquist, Loren Lindholm, Tricia Sorensen, and Neale Murray, Chair.

As committee chair I am grateful for the active involvement of all of these committee members and especially for the committed participation of so many members of our congregation in the ministries that the committee supports. This high level of congregational support is also visible in the significant part of our church budget that goes toward outreach.

Following are brief summaries of this year's committee activities associated with each of our ministries:

Cuernavaca

This year we started our church planting support of Jesus Flores in the Xoxocottla community. This two year commitment of \$100 a month started in September. This summer we also hosted a group of young people from the Cuernavaca congregation. They went along with our young people on a trip led by Pastor Brian to North Dakota.

Missions and Conference

Although we would like to be increasing the amount of our budget that goes to these denominational ministries that does not seem realistic at this present time. When, however, you factor in the amount we do give, through the private support of ministries such as Covenant Kids Congo and other denominational projects we are in fact a substantial denominational supporter.

Furniture Ministry

This ministry lead by Dave Enquist has faithfully met the first Saturday of each month. This ministry which we do in partner with Love, INC. continues to meet often desperate living situation needs. It is staffed by eight to ten faithful regulars who are serving others with joy and compassion.

Starter Kits

Our starter kit ministry led by Claudia Nauman and Tricia Sorensen, which is also a partner work with Love INC, has had a year of significant growth. This relatively new ministry is actively meeting some of the most basic living needs of those who move from homelessness to a new life in a home. The members of the Women's Bible Study have been active supporters of this ministry as well as others who have volunteered to assemble and deliver these kits.

Feed My Starving Children

Dennis and Carol Dieball are now leading this ministry which is located close to our church. We have been active supporters of this ministry; sending food packing teams at least

twice a year and most dramatically having a substantial part of our congregation pack food on the last Sunday morning of our ministry fair.

Food Pantry

With Kathy Nelson's leaving Ann Frost has taken over the planning of our congregations part of the food pantry ministry. We partner in this ministry with Community Christian Church where the pantry is housed, located in North Waukegan. Here again we have eight to ten faithful members who come at least once a month and spend from 9 a.m.—12 noon either packing food or registering clients. This year we have also been offering free new testaments to our clients which they have been eager to take and use. This is a ministry that we take a special offering for and our congregation gave over \$5000 last year to support this most urgent need.

Christmas Adopt-a-Family

Joan Groody has actively organized and supported this ministry. This year the congregation bought Christmas presents for fifteen families whose names we received from Catholic Charities. We used a different format this year in having the families come to the church for their gifts where we had some light refreshment in the narthex hosted by either Marti, Pastor Brian or the Outreach chair.

Ministry Fair

In the past ministry fairs have been held on a single Sunday and have occurred every four or five years. This year the committee changed the format to a multi-week one with two brief presentations given each Sunday in the Worship service. After the service there were also ministry displays in the narthex where members could sign up to join the ministry.

While the committee felt that this new format worked well, it is raising questions about future ministry fairs. Questions like should the fair beheld every other year? Also, should presentations be longer and done in Sunday School? Should there be an online signup process? While the FMSC worship experience was a good one, are there other ministry experiences that we should offer on that final fair Sunday?

In conclusion, I am very pleased with this years' outreach work of the congregation and the committee. That satisfaction, however, does not stop me from asking questions about further service. Should we offer more ministries or less to the congregation? How do we effectively help the congregation move to a more directly evangelistic witness and what do we mean by evangelism in this context? Finally, how do we shape our ministries to more effectively connect to the hearts and lives of those we serve or should be serving?

STEWARDSHIP COMMITTEE REPORT

The Stewardship Committee gives thanks and praise for the generosity of our congregation. Because of the generosity of LLC members and friends, we are happy to report that although we fell short of our original budget goal, contributions received in 2013 combined with a reduction in expenses have allowed us to meet our actual operating expenses for the year. Total giving towards the operating budget was \$466,096. In addition to the giving of time and talent, \$52,198 went to World Relief, PADS, Adopt-A-Family, Love INC, Food Pantry, Benevolence Fund, Youth Ministry, Capital Improvement, Building Fund, Camper Fund, and Children's Ministry.

On Sunday October 27, 115 members of the LLC church family participated in a Feed My Starving Children packing event. Donations from the larger church community amounting to \$5659 made it possible for us to serve and pack almost 25,000 meals!



The LCC Endowment Fund established at the beginning of the year with Covenant Trust Company currently has a balance of \$2500. The Endowment Fund is a way of providing our congregation with a perpetual source of income to complement and support of the church's ministries and missions, as well as providing our membership a vehicle through which to make legacy gifts to the church.

As a church we continue to implement good stewardship of God's creation as we expand our recycling efforts and the reduction of paper products.

The Stewardship Committee thanks you for your continued support as we join in faith

and anticipation of a new pastor and ministry opportunities coming to us. We continue to trust in God to provide for the needs of His church. As we grow as faithful stewards we discover that one of the most joyous aspects of being a follower of Jesus is being generous with the provisions God has given to each of us.

SEARCH COMMITTEE FOR SENIOR PASTOR

Since our first meeting in April 2013, we have been diligently working to find the person God has chosen for our next Senior Pastor.

The first several months of the committee's efforts laid the groundwork for our present work. One of our first duties was to create a job description. This is posted on the church web site and includes the following criteria: Ordained in the Sacrament and Word with eight years experience as a senior pastor preferred. The second task was to create a congregational survey to elicit feedback from members and friends. In addition, a sub-committee spent hours interviewing staff members to gain their perspective on the senior pastor position.

Once this work was completed, we were ready to receive candidate profiles from Reverend Jerome Nelson, Conference Superintendent. To date, we've received approximately 60 profiles. Some profiles were recommended by Reverend Nelson or other conference superintendents. Others we requested based on input from LCC members and friends or interested individuals. Because of the investment each candidate has made in the process, we are committed to praying for each person whose profile comes to us. We are also committed to making sure we give each candidate the time in review that they deserve.

Informal phone conversations have occurred with twenty pastors and we are about to enter into face-to-face conversations with some of these candidates at the Covenant's Midwinter Conference at the end of January. Following these conversations, we will begin listening to sermon tapes of those candidates we believe best match the needs of Libertyville Covenant Church.

Please continue to pray for our committee. Pray for clarity. Ask God to show us which person He has called to be our pastor. Pray for patience. Ask God to grant the committee an extra dose of humility and patience. Pray for good health. Ask God to watch over us and keep us from getting tired, sick and overwhelmed. Pray for the candidates. 




