
The Christian spiritual journey is a journey we take with others. Each of us must take our own journey, and for each of us that journey will be unique. But none of us is intended to make that journey alone.

During the 4 Sundays in February we will be viewing and discussing a video series titled "You Lost Me" by David Kinnaman. David is a coauthor of the bestselling book, "unChristian" and the president of the Barna Research Group. In "You Lost Me" David examines Christians ages 18 to 29, exposing why they leave the church and rethink their faith. This series will help you understand why the next generation often sees the church



as overprotective, shallow, anti-intellectual, exclusive, repressive, and intolerant of doubt. You'll hear the voices of young people who want to be part of a community of faith but have been marginalized by the church. And you'll discover loving, biblical ways to reconnect to them with kindness, compassion, and humility. Ken Greenfield will facilitate the class.

Coffee Hour Rotation







SEARCH COMMITTEE UPDATE

1) Parents' Influence is Crucial

There is a common belief in our culture that parents wield less and less influence over their kids these days, and that those kids are increasingly abandoning the beliefs and values of their families of origin.

It is not true. It probably never has been.

What is true, according to Bengtson's study, is that young adults to-day are just as likely to share their parents' faith as they were in 1970. This is true whether you're looking at religious affiliation (What religion are you?), religious intensity (How religious are you?), religious participation (How often do you attend?), Biblical literalism (What's your view of the Bible?), or civic religiosity (How important should religion be in public life?). Across all these markers, parental influence is just as high as it was a generation ago.

In other words, parents continue to be the single greatest influence on their children's faith.

(A quick aside: Grandparents, interestingly, are a close second. The study found that grandparents, especially grandfathers, who are highly religious were more likely to have grandkids who were also highly religious. It turns out that **grandparents might be an underutilized asset** in many churches and youth groups, not to mention families themselves. Here's an article from Kara Powell with <u>Twenty Ideas for Grandparents</u> you can pass along right now!)

There are some differences in parental influence when the data is broken down by religious tradition, however. Mainline Protestant and Catholic parents appear to have less influence on their kids than they did in 1970. Evangelicals, Mormons, and Jews all have about the same influence. But those with no religious affiliation (often called "Nones") are significantly more influential in their kids' faith now than they were a generation ago.

In other words, the widely discussed "rise of the Nones" is not due to unprecedented numbers of young people abandoning their childhood faith. It seems largely due to families of Nones passing on that "Noneness" at a much higher rate than in the past.

The bottom line: *Parents matter.* They matter a lot. That's a very hopeful message churches could be sending to parents who are worried about their kids' faith.
