Journey to Seminary? by Pastor Brian Zahasky

uring the winter of 2002 I was here in the Chicago land area with my youth pastor from high school walking onto the campus of Trinity Evangelical Divinity school for a campus visit. I knew that I was about to embark on a new season of life and that God was preparing me for a call, even though I wasn't sure exactly what that call looked like. I was truly blessed to have someone who had gone before me and a church back home that supported me as I processed through the decision to attend seminary. Now that I am on the other side and pastoring such a great congregation here at LCC it is a blessing to have the opportunity to support and encourage Meghan Dejong and Kevin Vollrath who have received the call to serve the Lord vocationally and are about to embark on a new season of seminary.

Kevin Michael Vollrath

was born on June 30th 1993 at Lake Forest Hospital. We can truly claim Kevin as a child of the church. I have heard lots of fun stories of Kevin hiding under the pews during the service, playing tag with his twin brother Randy. I met Kevin as a fifth grader about to enter into middle school. Over the next seven years I had the pleasure to walk along side this young man and watch as God developed His

plan in Kevin's life. Kevin when reflecting on his faith journey names his parents and camp as primary influences. He remembers a time talking with his parents about communion not as a "snack" but rather as a symbol of our savior's body and blood. One of the things

Kevin said about his conversion that caught my attention was the idea that his conversion was not so much a moment as it was about a process of faith in Christ "becoming real to me". He said he gave his life to Jesus many times (at least annually) at camp and it wasn't until high school that those pieces of church, camp, mission trips, confirmation and what he was learning from his parents started to fit together. Those pieces started to form a call on his life in his experience at CHIC. This was the first time he felt a voice calling him to into vocational ministry. In Kevin's word, "After CHIC, my secret was out and I began to discern what it would mean to be a pastor." Kevin is graduating this spring from the University of Chicago and just announced that he will be attending Princeton seminary *in the fall. When asked why* he felt led to attend seminary, Kevin said, "I'm going to seminary because I believe it's what God has ordained for the next step in my life and because I believe education is essential to being a pastor. Knowing the Word, practicing preaching, understanding church history not only pastors but the church in its tradition." This is an exciting season for Kevin and it's such a blessing to recognize that his church had a vital role in helping him get to this point in his life!




ADULT SUNDAY SCHOOL - 9:30 a.m.



Meghan De Jong was born on February 16th, 1987 at Swedish Covenant Hospital and is the oldest of four. I met Meghan when she was a senior in high school hanging out with our LCC students on a One Life retreat. It wasn't until a completely God ordained opportunity that we would meet again. During the summer of 2012 I was on my way down to Lurie Children's Hospital to be with Caitlin Bethancourt and her family before her major surgery. On my way to the hospital I got a call from Marti letting



me know that there was a family with covenant connections also at Children's. They had just had their first child and there were some initial health concerns including being diagnosed with Down syndrome. After visiting Caitlin I went up a couple floors and sat with Meghan and their amazing baby boy, Brady, for the first time. It was through that short conversation that I sensed that God was alive in Meghan and was preparing her for a call that would eventually lead her to seminary. Meghan came to faith when she was four years old in her garage with her dad. She credits her parents, her church family, North Park Covenant Church, North Park University and Covenant Point Bible Camp for her Faith development. A key theme to her story is the place that all of these entities had in giving her space to talk openly and work out issues of faith as she grew up. A big part of working out her faith came in figuring out her true identity. She talks about her sophomore year of college as this freeing time in her life where she came to grips with what it meant to be a child of God. After college Meghan married her college sweet heart, Brad, in 2011 and started working for Athletico where she is currently employed. She commented that although she enjoyed her work at a certain point it wasn't enough. She wasn't able to be intentional enough in her faith and began exploring different options. The more she looked at ministry options the more she kept coming back to this desire to know more about the God that she was serving. She prayed and invited others to pray with her and through a period of discernment felt that seminary was the next step for her. Her hope is to develop a deeper theological foundation while continuing to explore the idea of identity and how God forms and shapes us to become the people we are today. Over her short time here with us at LCC Meghan has helped spear head the "Where is it written" group and been our key middle school ministry leader. We are so blessed to have Meghan, Brad and Brady as part of our church family. It will be a tremendous blessing to continue walking with this family as they become members here and as Meghan starts her seminary career at North Park in the fall!

SEARCH COMMITTEE UPDATE



Dear Friends, In these next few weeks, we are asking for prayer for our daughter Kari and her husband Neal Johnson, as they prepare for their trip to the Congo in early March. They applied and were accepted to work as nurses in the recovery room for Mercy Ships, a Christian run organization. Mercy Ships takes decommissioned ships and transforms them into "floating" hospitals. The ship is



currently docked in the port of Pointe Noire. Many people come from miles around, hoping to be picked to have surgery. The surgeries and hospital stay are free for the patients. Some of the surgeries they do are for cleft palates, cataracts, malformed limbs and facial disfigurement due to huge benign tumors, some of which impinge the patient's ability to eat and even breathe. We ask specifically that you pray for Kari and Neal as they prepare themselves physically to go to Africa, and also as they prepare spiritually, to serve God through using their nursing skills to help heal the people of Congo. 4 steps to help a stressed teenager by Kara Powell

Know a stressed teenager? Me too. Lots of them.

Evidence is mounting that this generation of young people experiences more stress than any previous generation. Not only that, but teenage stress is starting to reach adult levels.

According to a <u>recent survey</u> of 1000 young people ages 13-17 conducted by the American Psychological Association, **more than 27% report feeling "extreme stress" in the last year**, a number that exceeds adults' self-reported stress levels.

Here's a more nuanced look at the stress young people report:

- Unsurprising to anyone who's spent time with a teenager recently, the **effort required to manage time and balance activities** is a "somewhat" or "very significant" stressor to 59% of the young people surveyed.
- Stress is affecting young people physically. Over 32% of respondents say they **experience headaches** because of stress.

Unfortunately, only about 37% of the teenagers surveyed exercise or walk to manage stress. More common are less healthy activities, such as playing video games (46%) and spending time online (43%).

What can you do to help a stressed teenager?

- 1. Beware of what your own stress is communicating. Whether you are a leader or a parent (or both), kids pick up on our stress, and it can increase their own.
- 2. Ask them how they are feeling about their schedule and pace. This is a question I regularly ask my 13 year-old son to understand the demands on his time and focus, and navigate potential overloads.
- If you're a parent, talk with your family about specific ways your home can be less stressful. Maybe it means getting more prepared for school the night before, or putting on mellow music right before dinner or bedtime, or creating a weekly schedule that's in your kitchen so everyone knows what each day holds.
- 4. **Help them say "no."** Kids are even worse at saying "no" than adults because they don't want to miss out. Help them say "no" to activities and invitations that are good but not great.
