Soup's On! by Julie Dahlberg

How can you love your neighbors if you don't really know them? Jesus's command to love our neighbors weighed heavily on Scott and I several years ago when I read a magazine article about Soup Night. The author was a woman living in Boston. She started a weekly dinner in her home for her neighbors and co-workers. The connections she described happening between these people-who had been strangers before --captured me. God had been preparing us to host something like a Soup Night, by opening up time in our calendar, and sparking a desire to know and love our neighbors. We decided to try it, to step into obedience and open our home, and God fanned that spark into a full-fledged fire!

Soup Night is a simple concept that you can modify a million different ways. It doesn't have to be soup, or fall/ winter, or weekly. Here's how we did it:

• We declared October through March to be Soup Season. (It falls between boys' and girls' soccer seasons, which Scott was coaching at the time.) April 2014 Volume 20, Issue 3

- We chose Thursday, because it was still a weekday so it wouldn't be mistaken for a party, but late in the week, just when folks are ready for a break in meal planning and prepping.
- We invited all of the neighbors whose houses touch ours, coworkers and family friends that live close. The invitation says:



"Come to our house for dinner. We'll make soup, you bring something to share or a smile! Come one Thursday, or come every Thursday, no RSVP, soup's on at 5:30!"

• We made soup every Thursday, usually two big pots, filled a pitcher with water, and waited to see who would come, and what would happen.

We invited A LOT of people, but they don't ever all come on the same Thursday. That is what is so fun to see: who makes it and when, who meets whom, and how we discover week after week that the world is indeed small. And then, some of those people see each other again, on another Thursday, or bump into each other in the community, and they ask about the things that they'd talked about at Soup Night, and relationship starts to happen!

We began hosting Soup Nights in 2002, and did it for five years. We took a break for a few years, and then this year, after a major kitchen re-do and addition, we started it back up again. We have been excited to see this year, just as in years past, that God uses an open door to reveal Himself, draw others to Him, and to each other He created us all with a desire to know and be known. It isn't the soup. It isn't the fabulously (ha!) decorated home. It isn't the plan or program or table-settings. It is the invitation to come in, have some dinner, have a conversation, and get to know folks beyond the quick wave or chat about the weather or the Blackhawks. God uses the open door.


