Secret Identities *by Pastor Steve Larson*

Bruce Wayne. Clark Kent. Peter Parker. Every good superhero needs a secret identity, an alter ego that provides them the necessary anonymity when the villains of the day come knocking. How better to keep our family safe from being used as pawns than by hiding our true identity behind a mask (or a pair of glasses? Never quite understood that one, Mr. Kent.)

Unfortunately, we can keep secret identities in the church as well. We can hide who we truly are behind the masks of Always Happy Woman, or Successful Man, or My Family Is Perfect Boy. But we keep these identities not to protect others but simply to protect ourselves. Imagine if everyone knew how broken or hurting or fearful or tempted we really were?

One of our core values as God's people is authenticity. After all, Jesus came to save us, not characters we play. When Jesus met

the woman at the well in John 4, the first thing He helped her with was her authenticity. "Go and get your husband," Jesus told her. "I don't have a husband," she evaded. "This is true," Jesus says. "In fact, you've had 5 husbands, and



the guy you're living with now isn't one of them." Jesus isn't just showing off here. He's telling this woman that it isn't worth playing games with Him, trying to hide behind a secret identity. He's telling her that He knows, sees right through the disguise, and loves her anyway.

Psalm 139, one of the most beloved Psalms in the Bible,

speaks to this idea of “being known”...

¹³For you created my inmost being; you knit me together in my mother’s womb.

¹⁴I praise you because I am fearfully and wonderfully made; your works are wonderful, I know that full well.

¹⁵My frame was not hidden from you when I was made in the secret place.

When I was woven together in the depths of the earth,

¹⁶ your eyes saw my unformed body.


All the days ordained for me were written in your book before one of them came to be.”

God knows us better than we know ourselves, and He loves us anyway.

What aspects of yourself do you keep hidden? What pieces are you hiding from others? What might you be hiding even from yourself? As we approach Halloween, a season of masks and trickery, let me encourage you to work this month at being truly authentic, removing the masks, and putting away the secret identities. God knows you inside and out, and let me promise you that He will never condemn you for being honest with Him. Anything we share with Him is not a surprise to Him, and is all a part of building a relationship, and that’s what life is all about.

Meet Our Deacons by Dennis Dieball



Who are the Deacons, what role do we play in the church's life, and how might we be of service to you? As we say good-bye to summer and begin our new church year, we thought it might be helpful to introduce (or re-introduce) ourselves to the congregation and remind you just why we're here and what we do.

The word "Deacon" comes from the Greek, *diakonos*, and is translated "to minister" or "to serve". In the Scriptures, the office of Deacon originates in the selection of seven men, including Stephen, to assist with the charitable work of the church as recorded in Acts 6. Our group consists of 10 members – Bonita Westerberg, Bruce and Merileen Thorsen, Owen and Linda Youngman, Janis Carlson, Karin Anderson, Teresa Anderson, Carol Dieball, and me (Dennis) as chair. One of the points in our roles and responsibilities describes the Deacons as "servant leaders who model the Christian message and values of service, hospitality, and care that we are called to through Scripture".

The Worship Committee is a subgroup under Deacons and it is in that capacity that you may be most familiar

with seeing us at work, serving communion and assisting with special and seasonal services such as during Lent or Advent, but we do far more than that. For example, the Deacons are the primary point of contact for those seeking membership in the church. We also work with the ushers and greeters to emphasize hospitality to members and visitors. Did you know the Deacons provide guidance and support for our small groups? If you've ever attending the annual winter retreat at St. Mary's Seminary, participated in a small group, or enjoyed a guest speaker or visiting choir, chances are the Deacons were involved in helping to provide these opportunities for spiritual growth and renewal.

Surely the area to which our hearts are most connected is in caring for those in need within our congregation. Whether it's assisting the pastor in visitations, sending cards and flowers to the sick and shut-in, arranging rides, administering the benevolent fund, or praying with and for our members and their families, this is where the Deacons try most to let our lights shine as we walk with those in need.

Fall Women's Ministry Event



world. Since 1993, Samaritan's Purse has delivered over 100 million boxes to children in over 100 countries. Individuals, families, and groups fill these boxes with toys, school supplies, hygiene items, and notes of encouragement.


