ith a pending baby on the way, this will be an interesting Advent season for our family. Advent is the season of the church year centered on waiting and preparation. We get the tree out and decorate it, string the lights on the house, and make our favorite cookies. We go to parties and watch our traditional Christmas shows from Rudolph to Charlie Brown. And though we often forget, the purpose behind these activities is to prepare us for the coming of the Christ Child on Christmas Eve. Oh, we think it's all about a month-long celebration of "Christmas", but the true celebration is yet to come! You see, the reality is that the celebration truly begins in the season we call Christmastide, or the 12 days between Christmas

Day and Ephiphany (yes, that's where "The 12 Days of Christmas" comes from). For those 12 days, we celebrate Jesus' birth and all that means to us. Everything leading up to Christmas Day is still Advent, still waiting, still preparing.



"For to us a child is born, to us a son is given, and the government will be on his shoulders. And he will be called Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace." (Isa. 9:6)

family? Where would the baby sleep? What do we need to buy before the birth? And like the approach to Advent, it seemed an overwhelming task. But as time passes, we begin to get excited. How fun it will be to watch the growth, the learning, the awe and excitement of new things! To teach sports and music and God's love from the beginning again! And this time, to share it not just with one other but with 4 others! And yet, all of this is still waiting, still anticipation, still preparation. The true celebration will be on first day that this little one enters our world.

In the hustle and bustle of the season, can you maintain your focus not just on Jesus, but on the reality that all of this is still preparation for the true celebration? When we take time each day of Advent to stop and remember what this planning and baking and decorating and traveling and scheduling and... is all about, we can remember that our true celebration is yet to come. What could you do this year from Dec. 25 to Jan. 5 to celebrate Jesus' birth that you haven't before? Not more work or decoration – that was for Advent – but true celebration, worship, and rejoicing? Let me encourage you to plan now for the 12 Days of Christmas, and see how God might honor your celebration of His Son, Immanuel, God with us.

What a wonderful year this has been! God has provided for Libertyville Covenant Church in so many ways and we have much to be thankful for.

Our members continue to respond generously to God's goodness by supporting ministries outside of our church including; Love INC., Food Pantry, Feed My Starving Children, PADS, Covenant World Missions and Covenant World Relief. We are, however, at that time of the year where we are asking all members to help in contributing the extra financial support needed to meet our current year operating expenses. During the transition time between senior pastors our staff and leaders have managed expenses carefully and, in fact, have reduced expenses this year. Yet as of the end of October our operating fund balance had a deficit of \$54,820.

We have advanced our church's mission while maintaining a balanced budget in recent years, despite a challenging economy. Typically we receive approximately 15% of our annual operating budget in the closing weeks of the year. Please prayerfully reflect upon God's abiding presence and abundant provision as you consider your year-end giving to the operating fund.

The Stewardship Committee thanks you for your financial support of our church which allows us; to fellowship with each other, to help each other grow spiritually, to serve each other, to tell others about Christ here and around the world, and to worship our Lord together each Sunday.

As part of our sanctuary improvements we will also installed a loop system within the sanctuary for those with hearing assistant devices. We appreciate the work

of our Trustees and Neale Murray who have been researching and coordinating this project. We anticipate the sanctuary work will be completed in time for Advent. Memorial Funds have been designated to be used for the loop system and general funds have been set aside for the carpet.


