Who Are We?

n every church I've served, the same question has risen:
Who are we? Whether in the context of a desire for more members or more mission, more clarity for our world or ourselves, everyone wants to know the answer. What makes us different than the church down the street?

While the biblical answer is usually given in the form of a metaphor – we are the Bride of Christ, a flock, a body, a family – the answer specific to any given church requires us to be an engaged part of the life of the church. Once we are, we soon see what de-

fines us as a church.

For the last year, I've watched and listened, read and discussed this question, and I have an answer. Who are we at LCC? What defines us?

1. Community – being a part of LCC is not about an hour on Sunday morning, or tak-

ing part in a program on Wednesday nights. It is about joining a group of people who care for each other, watch out for each other, share lives with each other, and truly find value in doing so. "We love to be together no matter what the reason," I've heard again and again, and

I've seen this truth in hundreds of different ways. This is not a universal reality across the gamut of churches, but is a defining characteristic here.

2. Relationships – a twin concept is the focus on the relationships we have with each other, with God, and with our local community. While some can be part of the church without building relationships with others, this is rare at LCC.

While many churches focus on programming, theology and doctrine, or providing for the needs and desires of its members, our focus on our many relationships is what drives us.

- 3. Authenticity we are striving to be real people with real brokenness standing together before our real God. While we still hide behind masks and personae, we recognize that this is a growth area for most of us and we intentionally work on it. Being real with each other is the only way we can grow in our relationships which build community.
- 4. Engagement truly believing that we are part of "the priesthood of all believers", we recognize that every one of us is empowered with gifts needed to accomplish God's work. And so we think it's important that everyone takes part in the life and ministry of LCC as they are able. This is not a good church to attend as a bystander you will be offered multiple opportunities to plug in!

We call these our Core Values, and they answer that elusive question: Who are we? We are a church where the people are encouraged and expected to be engaged authentically in building relationships with others, God and our world so that our church community may grow stronger and larger in Jesus' name. This is who God has called us to be, to the praise of His glory.

October WORSHIP . . .

If someone asked you what the mission statement of our church was, could you tell them without looking it up? Most church members in most churches can't. And if we don't know our mission, it becomes infinitely harder to accomplish it. This fall, our sermon series



will focus on The Mission, looking at the big ideas of the Church, and the big values of our church. This is a great season to invite friends and neighbors to worship to hear just what the church is all about.

It is with great excitement that we announce that we have a candidate for the Associate Pastor to Youth position at Libertyville Covenant Church! Over the past seven months, the Search Committee has met regularly and worked through 32 candidate profiles. The committee reached out to six candidates to schedule interviews. 


