ur world needs hope desperately. In the last month, we have once again seen the hopelessness of our world in glaring detail. From the refugee crisis to the attacks in Paris to the continuing racism across our campuses to the violence in our cities to the hyper-polarization of our political dialogue, there

is very little cause for hope coming from our world. Someone commented to me recently that watching the news, any news, was an exercise in battling hopelessness.

As we enter our Advent season, we are once again reminded that Christianity is a relationship of hope, both for the future and the present. It is fitting that in the Covenant hymnal, the Advent section comes immediately after the section titled, "Promise and Covenant". As a season of preparation for Jesus' coming, both at Christmas and again in the not-too-distant future.

Advent is a season of hope. What the idea of Covenant and Promise were to the People of God in the Old Testament, so Jesus is to us living in the New Testament, for Jesus is the fulfillment of the Covenant and Promise of Abraham, Moses, and the prophets.



To a world desperate for hope, we need to speak of change and transformation. Jesus brings restoration of the broken, redemption of sullied, and recuperation for the weary. Jesus brings life into death, grace into shame, and ultimately hope into hopelessness. ety will reveal the reality of our faith to all who hear us. May our every word, spoken or typed, texted or posted, be filled with the hope of Jesus for which we expectantly wait this Advent season. And may our lives reveal our Savior who brings hope into every situation we face.


