Joyfully Generous by Pastor Steve Larson

We serve an unbelievably generous God. Our King wants to give us more than we know how to handle. Our Father wants to bless us more deeply than we could imagine. Our Friend wants us to be absolutely shocked at the depth of His mercy, grace, and love given to us every day. We serve an

unbelievably generous God.

From Genesis 1. we see God's generosity displayed in the way He created. Before calling the sun, moon, and stars into being (day 4), He gave them a space to be and light to shine (day 1&2). Before creating animals and humankind (day 6), He brought forth both land on which to live and vegetation to eat (day 3). Before we have a need, God has already met it.

And God's generosity isn't limited to our physical needs. Romans 5:8 shows His provision for our spiritual needs before we even

knew we had them. "While we were yet sinners, Christ died for us." It is not our goodness or righteousness that called Jesus to die for us. It was God's generosity to His creation, yet again meeting our needs before we even knew we had them.

In complete opposition to the health-and-wealth gospel we hear on TV, let me say that God won't always give us all we think we deserve, or even all we think we need. It is up to God to give as much as He knows we need. As generous as God is, He will never hurt us through His giving, but will give just the right amount.

As Christ-followers, we seek to imitate God. But more

than obedience leads us to this different life, this holy life. If our decision to obey God comes from a begrudging guilt or a desire to "pay God back" for all He has done, then our spiritual life becomes obligatory rule-following. We lose the joy of giving which is the heart of God's generosity. Malachi doesn't show us God giving what He feels He has to, with a pout on His face. Paul in his letter to the Ephesian church shows us a God who "...lavished upon us..." the riches of His grace. These are images of joyful giving, giving with a smile, giving that says, "I love you" instead of "look at how obedient and generous I am."

How might our thanksgiving be different this year if we were to see it as a chance to live not only gratefully but also generously? What if our actions said, "Thank you, God, for all you've given" and also, "Let me give like You, Lord; with a smile on my face and joy in my heart."

The Church Council and Search Committee are proud to present our candidate for the position of Associate Pastor to Youth. After seven months of prayer and discussion, looking through 32 pastoral profiles, holding virtual interviews with 3 individuals and face-to-face interviews with 2 of those, we are putting forth Rev. Paul Couleur as our candidate.



Rev. Paul Couleur, graduate of University of Missouri and North Park Theological Seminary, was born and raised in Deerfield, IL, and baptized, confirmed, and married at Winnetka Covenant Church. He has served in Gothenburg, Sweden, as Minister to Youth and Young Adults; in Carrollton, TX, as Youth Pastor; in Chicago, IL, as Athletic Chaplain at North Park University; and in Campton Hills, IL, as Pastor of Country Covenant Church. He, his wife Rachel, and their two children Titus and Genevieve currently live in Deerfield and have been serving here as our Interim Pastor to Youth. Gardening Weeding, raking, and cleaning up.

Construction Various projects including drywall repair, deck repair, replace door latches and stops, duct work repair, cut new vents in shower doors, screen repair, caulking, add fiberglass board to showers, add wood trim around A/C units, install down spouts, electrical labeling on circuit breakers (electrician), work on A/C-heating units (someone with this knowledge), and more.



At times I have wondered if God might feel like the guy from the Verizon commercial that is constantly popping up in places all over the world asking this same question, "Can you hear me now? Can you hear me now?" Now that the school year is underway and we are all busy getting back into the busy rhythms of life, God is still speaking wondering if we're listening. In these first couple of months serving at LCC I have learned just how jam packed our lives can be. It is a break neck speed which makes it challenging at times to hear one's own thoughts let alone hear from God. Let's be honest with ourselves perhaps all of us have calendars that would benefit from slowing down a bit.

This fall we have been continuing to discover ways to shift away from the temptations of the world and bring low the barriers that stand between us and God. During the retreats we paused for a moment beside still waters hoping to hear from God as he continues to speak. We reflected on rhythm and using the instrument that is our person to continue with God furthering the Kingdom. Questions were asked if we were playing in tune with the song or perhaps playing a different tune all together. Are we listening to God and can we hear his voice and direction? When we hear God's voice how do we respond?

Returning home from the retreat I wondered were we still long enough to hear from God? At a silent-solitude retreat for 12 hours at Covenant Harbor it took quite a while to actually be ready to listen. The first six hours of my day were spent in a comfortable chair overlooking Geneva Lake where my thoughts raced and my words were many with God. There was no room for God to speak too. My mind was so active that I didn't even hear the water, see the boats, or even notice the sun that was shining until after lunch. This brings me back to the question, have we been silent and still before God long enough to actually listen for God's voice? Is God asking, "Can you hear me now?" In the afternoon, my person was still before God to hear him speak of his love for me, reminders of hope, and assurance of his guidance and plan for my life. What refreshing words to hear. This has me wondering, what might God be trying to say to each and every one of us as we race from one event to the next? Might we all continue to be still before God making room for God to speak?

One way our youth will respond to God's invitation to serve him will be to attend the Believe, Love, Serve day at Covenant Harbor on November 21st. That day we will join hands for a day of service, fellowship, and fun. This is an event for the whole church to come together and serve. There will be child care provided so all can attend for the day. Might we continue to be willing as Isaiah was to hear from God and offer ourselves saying "Here am I. Send me!" Grace and Peace, Paul


