grew up in Livonia, MI in the 70's and 80's. A suburb of Detroit, Livonia was a lily white community and so I grew up thinking that the two black students in my 2500 student high school meant we were diverse. And while we had plenty of "service projects" in the city throughout my youth group vears, these often did more to emphasize the racial differences than to address them. It wasn't until college in downtown Chicago that I really was faced with the reality of my own racist upbringing.

When a friend of mine let me know that she had never been comfortable in her own body, believing that she was actually male and that she would be starting a new life as a guy, I wasn't

sure what to think about it. I'd had gay friends before, but never met anyone who was transgendered. And then, when he began

asking whether God could still love him after this, things got really interesting.

Growing up in the theater world, many of my close friends were Mormons. All I knew about Mormons was that they had huge families, didn't drink caffeine, and were the nicest, most moral people I'd ever met. When we started talking about their faith and how it differed from mine, I was faced with the reality that



my experience of life was just different from that of others. In fact, I began to realize that in many ways, I was the "other" in Continued from page 1

these discussions, not them.

How do we deal with people that are different than us? What is our reaction to those who we might label "other"? And how do we feel when we realize that we are as much "other" as they are? Do we react with violence, attacking those who are different with fists, insults, or gossip? Do we react with fear, avoiding them and all talk of them, enclosing ourselves in our own little bubbles of similarity? Do we react with intrigue, seeking to learn about them, study them, and grow our own knowledge base?

Each of these reactions ignores the reality that God has created us all and loves us all equally. 1 Sam. 16:7 says, "The Lord does not look at the things people look at. People look at the outward appearance, but the Lord looks at the heart." What if instead our reaction to those different than us was to build community with them? To get to know them not as subjects of study but as relationships to be grown? What if our disagreements were opportunities to learn about each other rather than to convince each other of our superiority or rightness? Phil. 2:3 says, "In humility, value others above vourselves." That means ALL others, not just the Others we happen to agree with, look like, or enjoy.

This April, we will be concluding our Easter season with a look at the disciples on the road to Emmaus, and then take up a month-long series titled "Other". Our world is torn when it comes to how we



deal with those who are different than us. Some want to dismiss and ignore people of other races, cultures, beliefs, or genders. Some want to idolize and mirror them. And still others want to go to battle against them. But what does the Word say about how I should interact with those who are "other" than I am? Come each Sunday this April and find out!



Seder

We're having a SEDER!

What do an Egyptian Pharoah, nine awful plagues, painted doorposts and lintels, and communion have to do with one another? Find out on April 23 beginning at 5:00 p.m. when the LCC family will be celebrating a Jewish SEDER.

What's a Seder? It is a joyous, festive meal that celebrates the Jewish Passo-



ver filled with scripture readings, questioning, singing, and prayers. It recounts the story of the Israelites' exodus from Egypt. Every Jewish household is commanded to celebrate the Passover in accordance with scripture (Exodus 12:5-19).

Jesus instructed Peter and John to prepare the Passover so that he could eat it with his disciples (Mark 14:13, Matt 26:17, Luke 22:8). As observant Jews, Peter and John knew what was involved. What they did not know was the new significance the meal would bring. Let's discover together how the components of the ritual point to why Jesus chose the Passover Seder to institute a new covenant with God's people.

Join us on April 23 at 5-8 p.m. for a whole evening of feasting and rituals! Food will be served about an hour or so into the celebration. There will be so much more than "matzah" the eye! Reservations are required as there is a tremendous amount of preparation to do for this celebration. This is a family event! Childcare will be available for infants — everyone is welcome!

"Every Kid a Camper"

LCC has always been committed to supporting the camping ministry of our conference at Covenant Harbor and Covenant Point Bible Camps. Initially the Christian Formation Committee instituted the "Every Kid a Camper" Fund to allow us to help families send their children to camp. Through the years many of our children have indicated that the camp experience has had a great impact on their decisions as they first committed their lives to Christ and began the journey to follow Him.

LCC continues to make camping ministries a priority for our children and we are grateful to be able to provide over \$5000 each year in scholarships and rebates for summer camps, retreats, mission trips and CHIC. A week at camp is now around \$600/student increasing the need for financial support.

We join with the Christian Formation Committee in sustaining the camp fund in making sure these needs are met. Please consider helping in this effort as this year once again, in addition to the Rummage Sale we will be holding an auction of goods and services to be offered for bid. We ask that each family (whether you have campers or not) start thinking of what you can offer & submit your items as soon as possible. The bidding will begin on May 8th and conclude at the All Church Picnic on May 22nd following the morning service. LIBERTYVILLE COVENANT CHURCH CAPITAL FUND CAMPAIGN

Have you noticed that things are changing at LCC? There are fewer empty seats during morning worship. There are more cars in the parking lot. There is activity going on in our building almost

every day of the week. LCC is having a fresh experience of God's mission and is growing! And with that growth comes an opportunity to tackle some projects that we have needed to address. In Faith the Stewardship Committee and Church Council have historically put together our church budget with a "necessity only" mindset, funding our immediate needs but not a reserve for major projects, instead relying on special congregational giving for these projects. In Faith we continued the mission of the church, praying that you would continue to be an integral part of our church family while reaching out to invite others looking for a church - those both close to and far from God - in essence, those who would also desire to be a part of the LCC family. We are of the conviction that the church is for the lost, the last, the least and the littlest, and the most important concern of the church is the human soul. During these most recent years the Church building was secondary. We know our physical church building could have looked a little better – inside and out! We appreciate your faith in us as you overlooked some blemishes that are long overdue to be replaced or repaired. In Faith we are putting this "Growing In Faith" Campaign together to restore and repair our church to an order where it can function best as we reach out to the community and meet the growing needs of our church family. We have faithfully prayed that your lives would be financially stable and growing. Now we are excited to reach out to you and "In Faith" ask that you help us get caught up. Our "In Faith" campaign is designed to bring awareness of the need, and challenge you, the congregation, to give "In Faith" to that need in order that we can continue to be a light in the community. 2nd Corinthians 9:8, "And God is able to make all grace abound toward you, that you, always having all sufficiency in all things, may have an abundance for every good work." We trust that as you give "In Faith" out of God's provision you will see His hand move in your life and the life of the Church.

Our Faith Plan: In faith we plan to perform necessary and timely repairs of the church building and parking lot as well as to replace the existing church van. Anticipated items include:

replacing the original 3 furnaces and the current van . . . parking lot resurfacing and improvement . . . new carpeting in the narthex and offices . . . roof repairs, sound system repairs and upgrades, and replacement of kitchen appliances as they break. (This plan does not include the cost of acquiring a portion of the neighboring property)

Our Faith Budget: As we have not previously set aside funds for this plan, we need to raise \$200,000 over the next 3 years. The immediate priority is to raise approximately \$55,000 in the first half of 2016 for the parking lot project. Please prayerfully consider a contribution of a one-time contribution or a pledged amount lasting up to the three years of the plan. We encourage the fulfilment of pledges by automatic funds transfer*. If you have further questions or require additional information please contact a member of the Stewardship Committee: John Christian, Wes Lindahl, Roch Tranel, Caren Vollrath, and Ken Werner.

Our Faith Prayer: Thank you, Lord, for the many provisions and blessings you have bestowed upon Libertyville Covenant Church. In faith we ask for your guidance as we seek wisdom to use and maintain the tools you have provided to carry out your Kingdom work and mission in our community. Enable each of us to be good and faithful stewards of all your gifts you have entrusted to us.

Coffee Hour Rotation
