Garden News by Nancy Borkman

"As you sow, so will you reap." Galatians 6:7

"Gardening is cheaper than therapy and you get tomatoes." Author unknown

"Weed it and reap." Anonymous

"To forget how to dig the earth and to tend the soil is to forget ourselves." Mahatma Gandhi

You've read many garden quotes over the years. Some are famous analogies. Some are folksy, some punny, and some profound. Most are true. Enjoy some thought that a few quotes generated about the garden in my mind.

"Tickle the earth with a hoe, it will laugh a harvest." - Mary Cantell

Did you see the garden in its glory last (2015) summer? Harvests of green beans, beets, bok choi, zucchini, yellow squash, cucumbers, peppers, broccoli, tomatoes, eggplant, napa cabbage, and raspberries were bountiful. This 2016 growing season wasn't so prolific. Job demands interfered with my tending to the garden in the spring and travel interrupted early summer garden chores. There was no time to start seeds in March and April. No time to turn the beds then either. It was wonderful to have help from Nancy McLinden, the Petersons, and Jerry Junas who contributed materials, time, and sweat at different times in the growing season. Five beds were planted with tomatoes and zucchini plants on June 3 before going out of town for 10 days. Later beans, swiss chard, beets, and kale got planted. Harvests were inconsistent and sporadic and most were not big enough to deliver to Trinity, so produce was distributed among church members on Sunday mornings.

"When weeding, the best way to make sure you are removing a weed and not a valuable plant is to pull on it. If it comes out of the ground easily, it is a valuable plant." – Anon

The landscapers weeded the paths and beds twice to eliminate the eyesore of a weeds brought in with the unfinished/uncomposted horse manure (I didn't realize!). Unfortunately, the vicious roots (and yes, I mean vicious) were not addressed, and the good intentions were only cosmetic. Untouched roots were left to spread more thickly than before. The surrounding flowerbeds have become overgrown with bindweed (wild morning glories), grasses, and dandelions. It looks like Roundup will need to be applied as that bindweed and those thistles aren't going to give up their comfy home easily.

I tend our LCC garden with love and care because it is a place of rejuvenation and refuge. This garden is a nicer garden than I can have at my own house and with better sun, too. Sitting listening to birds, seeing the sun rise or set as I work there brings me to closer to wholeness. When I'm there alone, it's a place I talk things over with God and listen to his response. When I'm there with others, it's a place of fellowship and good conversation. I don't work in the garden just for my gain. It's place of rejuvenation and refuge for others. The LCC garden is dedicated to the memory of Martha and Bob Peterson's son, and Kirsten Peterson's brother, Erik. They hang flowers and wreaths on the gate every season.

If you want to enjoy these things we've found there, come to the garden, to sit or to work. I'll be planning next year's layout and planning the seed order one afternoon in early January next to narthex fireplace. You come, too.



Pear & Beet Salad with Goat Cheese Makes: 4 servings

Vegetarian, Wheat Free, Gluten Free, Soy Free

- 1/4 cup orange juice
- 1 Tbsp. red wine vinegar
- Tbsp. extra virgin olive oil 1
- tsp. Dijon mustard
- tsp. brown sugar 1
- 1/8 tsp. each salt and ground black pepper
- 8 cups mixed salad greens
- 1 firm, ripe pear, halved lengthwise, cored, cut lengthwise into 1/4-inch thick slices
- 1 medium beet, steamed, peeled, cut (See Tip)
- 1 pkg. (4 oz.) goat cheese, crumbled
- 1/2 cup toasted pecans or walnuts, coarsely chopped

MIX juice, vinegar, oil, mustard, brown sugar and seasoning in bowl or shaker container.

ARRANGE remaining ingredients on 4 salad plates; drizzle with dressing. **SERVE** immediately.

Fresh Tips: **EXTRA** Sprinkle with craisins. HOW TO

To steam beets: Trim and scrub beets, keeping the skin on. Cut into quarters lengthwise, which shortens the cook time. Place a pot on the stove and bring ½-inch of water to a boil. Add the beets (use a steamer basket inside the pot, if you have one). Reduce heat and cover. Cook 10 to 15 minutes or until beets are tender. Allow to cool; peel beets gently with a paring knife or rub skins off with a paper towel. Cut crosswise into slices.

To toast nuts: Spread nuts into even layer on baking sheet. Place in 350°F oven for 5 to 10 minutes, or until lightly browned, stirring half way. Transfer to a plate to cool down.
