Tracking our Exercise this Summer

"Lord, teach us to pray..." – Luke 11:1

fter a heart scare last November, my in-laws bought me a FitBit for Christmas. It tracks my heart rate, number of steps I've taken each day, number of calories burned, number of flights of stairs I've climbed. and a whole lot more. And while not completely accurate (I occasionally get a reward for meeting a short walking goal while never leaving my desk), just wearing it can help me to remember to eat better, exercise more, and just be an all-around more healthy guy.

Today I ponder my Spiritual FitBit. There are a number of them, but one I love is called the Prayer of Examen, created and popularized by St. Ignatius in the mid 1500's. It is a simple method of prayer, but one that helps us to track our spiritual growth each day.

The Examen is usually done just before ending the day, but can be a morning

exercise as well. The steps are quite simple...

- 1. Quiet yourself and focus on God's presence with you.
- 2. Pray that God will reveal what ever He wants you to notice.
- Think back through your day, taking note of where you see God at work.



- 4. Pay attention to your emotions as you review the day and see what excites, scares, or intrigues you.
- Choose one or two moments from the day and pray about them. See what God might want you to learn from them.
- 6. Look forward to tomorrow. Be open to God's activity in your life for the next day.

As I pray the Examen each night, it's like looking over my FitBit stats. How many steps on my own spiritual journey did I take today? Did I reach my goal? How much work did I do to exercise my soul? Were there any steep climbs (temptations?) I had to face, and did I face them or go around them?



I wonder what it would be like for you to track your spiritual progress this summer with an exercise like The Examen. What might you be like on Sept. 1 after three months of "examening" your days? Would it help to set an alarm for just before bedtime to remind you to take 5 or 15 minutes to think through the Examen? Would it help to do it with a friend, spouse, or even a child so you can hold each other accountable?

May God bless your summer, and may you see growth in your own spiritual journey before next September.


adviser and analyst.
