The Journey by Pastor Steve Larson

"You acquire the biblical story mostly through your feet, only peripherally through your eyes and ears." - Eugene Peterson

"The way is made by walking." - Antonio Machado

t is no coincidence that Christianity was originally called "The Way" (Acts 9:2). They might have called it "The Teaching" or "The Rules". These would have centered our faith in our head, as a set of beliefs to be held. They might have called it "The Love" or "The Happiness". This would have centered our faith in our heart, as a feeling to be had. But even as early as the first few years after Christianity became a Thing, they were calling it

"The Way". This centers our faith in our feet, in our hands, and in our living. Too often people as-

sume that Christianity is a religion of the head. So we attend studies, and read books, and listen to sermons. If we know the right things, believe the right things, then we are Christians. But the bible disabuses us of this notion. "Even the demons believe - and shudder." James tells us of a headbased faith. It is not enough to just know the right stuff.



People equally often assume that Christianity is a religion of the heart. So we share our feelings, and listen to rousing music, and attend worship that makes us "feel". If we just have enough compassion, and love God enough, then we are Christians. But again, the bible speaks to the danger of a feelings-based faith. "The

heart is deceitful above all things and beyond cure. Who can understand it?" (Jer. 17:9). It is not enough to just feel good about God.

Christianity is a journey. Our faith is made by walking this journey, not by thinking about it or feeling it. We grow when we live like Christ, loving those around us through our acts and our behavior. And though faith has an emotional part, and an intellectual part, both of these are there to serve the experiential part.

The early Covenant church began their gatherings with the question, "How goes your walk with God?" That's my question for you today. How is the journey? Think of a hike you've taken, and describe your walk of faith in those terms. Is it a steep uphill climb? Is it a time of rest with a beautiful overlook? Is it a narrow ledge over a steep drop in a thunderstorm? Or is it a flat path through a deep and beautiful wood? Take a minute and describe it.

Now, how might you slow down the frantic run of life and enjoy the walk with God today? Maybe it's a 30 minute coffee while reading the bible or a good book. Maybe it's a literal walk near a brook. Maybe it's a nap. Or maybe it's a conversation with a friend or loved one about spiritual things. Take the time today to find some slow enjoyment along your journey so that you might have the strength to continue to walk the Way this month.

On June 16 – 17, we will host a booth at Libertyville Days. Our purpose is to allow



May 21st is End of the Year Sunday!





As part of the LCC team's fundraising efforts they are making available some products for us to purchase.
