Beyond Sorry by Pastor Steve Larson

e tend to be really bad at repentance. It's a biblical call in each of our lives, integral to our faith journey, yet talk about repentance and people quickly begin to pull away. It is uncomfortable,

vulnerable, and forces us to face the fact that we are not as perfect as we pretend.

humbling, makes us

When was the last time you had to say, "I'm sorry" to someone? To whom did you say it? What was the circumstance? How

circumstance? How did it feel to say it?

Repentance begins with saying, "I'm sorry" but it doesn't end there. Repentance is beyond Sorry. Repentance is actually the actions that come after and due to our Sorry. To repent meals literally to turn around. When I sin, I've turned from God toward something else. This is sin. To repent means to turn around, away from that sin and back toward God again. Repentance is that act of



turning back to God. We see this in our families all the time. If I snap at my wife or kids, I need to say Sorry to them. But if I think all is well once I say it, I'm sorely mistaken. Simple words, if not defining an action, are not enough. When I snap at

them again 5 minutes after saying Sorry, I have just negated my Sorry and proven that I didn't repent. I did not turn away from my wrath and back to God.

This Lenten season, we'll be looking at repentance, for we have much to repent in our lives. We have been harsh toward our loved ones, unjust toward those we're supposed to fight for, and indifferent about things Jesus has called us to champion. Lent is preparation for the celebration of the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ. And repentance is the key. Let's come together and lament, and repent, and see what God might have in store for us.

Easter Sunday, we'll be looking at Matthew 21 and how repentance plays an essential part in our lives.



WELCOME TO ADULT SUNDAY SCHOOL

The adult Sunday school class meets in the sanctuary each week at 9:15 a.m.

On February 4 and 11 Paul Nauman will lead a class on Worldviews - the different fundamental assumptions and belief sets that different people have about reality. We'll explore how worldviews affect behavior, form values and shape culture. We'll also discuss the predominant worldviews in our world today and ways that they have even affected the church.

Starting on February 18 we'll take 6 Sundays - up through Palm Sunday - to read through part of the Old Testament. We'll start with the story of Jacob and Esau in Genesis 25 and read all the way through Israel's deliverance from Egypt in Exodus 15. As we did last fall with the Gospel of John we'll be reading these scripture passages out loud and discussing them afterward. Should be an interesting session again, and lead us right into Easter.



We appreciate the many hours you have dedicated to your areas of responsibility here at LCC.

Sometimes in this season of colds and flu we need the wisdom of those who have gone before. This tried and true recipe for good old fashioned chicken soup came from dear friends who probably still are making it to share with friends and neighbors in need of some tender care.

Rose's Chicken Soup

from Dolores Sessler & Jean Heintzelman

4-5 lb. roaster chicken 1 medium onion

1 T. low sodium salt 6-10 carrots

1 T. sugar 1 parsnip

1 t. pepper 1 parsley root

1/4 t. ginger 6-8 stalks celery

Remove giblets & fat, clean chicken with cold water, cut off legs and put legs and body in large pot with 2 1/2 quarts water. When boiling simmer & add salt, pepper, sugar, ginger, onion. Cover and simmer for 1 hour. Skim scum from top and add chopped vegetables every 15 minutes in following order: celery, carrots, parsnips, parsley root. Remove chicken, debone, de-skim, and return meat to pot.



Refrigerate and de-fat the next day.

It is SO good! AND good for you too!

LCC ANNUAL MEETING SUMMARY

The two hightlights of this year's annual meeting were that we ended the year in the black with strong giving beyond our budget to important outreach ministries and to our capital fund. This is the 3rd and final year of this campaign, and we will continue to operate with a capital balance that allows us to undertake expensive repairs without taking a special offering, as we were able to do with the organ this year. An improved parking lot, carpeting, a newer van, a new playground, are some examples of capital improvements we have been able accomplish. I know that I sleep better at night knowing that if we need a \$15,000 repair to the roof or our HVAC systems, we can just write a check, because of the faithful giving of our members. This church continues to be in a financially strong position.

Much of the meeting time was taken up in discussions of some proposed bylaw changes. The Council is proposing that we make some changes to our committee structure and add a "leadership team" to our structure. We would maintain the Church Council, but it would meet less frequently. We would reduce the number of standing committees from 7 to 5, and elevate Worship from a subcommittee to a standing committee with an elected leader. The leadership team would be made up of 5-7 elected members and the pastors. The Chair, Vice Chair, Secretary, and Treasurer would be a part of this team that meets monthly with the pastor(s) to check in on our finances, and to evaluate and plan our ministries in light of our mission. Planning and evaluation of our ministries has been historically a part of the Long Range Planning Committee, but this change would make planning, evaluation, and lay leadership of our ministries a cooperative and regular practice with our pastor(s).

I will be sending out the suggested bylaw changes and the rationale for them soon, after I make some of the minor changes/corrections suggested in our discussion. I will also create a visual organizational chart as well, so that these changes can be more clearly understood.

It is important to note that this new Leadership Team will not have authority over the Council or the ability to create new "rules" or policies for the church. The Congregation in a business meeting has the most authority, then the Council who are elected to represent the Congregation. The Leadership Team is intended to be a more flexible and cooperative group of lay people working more closely with the pastor(s), not a group with more centralized decision making power.


PADS
