Messengers *by Pastor Steve Larson*

As I write this article, news has just come of the death of Billy Graham. With his passing, our culture has lost a huge force in the spread of the Gospel message. As a pastor and adviser to power players from presidents to personalities, Graham could inspire faith and speak truth and love into situations and lives that no other could reach. Billy Graham allowed God to work through Him and was a model for millions of Christians the world over.

Like him, each of us carries a message from God to this world. We cannot claim that we don't have the message. We cannot claim that we haven't been

commanded to share it. We cannot claim that we cannot share it. We can only choose either to share it or not. We may not have the star power of Billy Graham, but we have the same calling.

"Go into all the world and make disciples of all nations..." (Matt. 28:19)

Billy Graham had access to people that few others did. To presidents from Harry Truman to Barak Obama and to leaders like Martin Luther King Jr. and Queen Elizabeth II Graham spoke the gospel message – the same one that we carry today. These are people you and I will never

even meet, let alone have the opportunity to share the gospel with. But at the same time, you have access to people who Billy Graham never did. Your colleagues, friends, classmates, teammates, and family have real conversations with you that they will never have with Billy Graham or any of the presidents with whom he shared the good news.

We each have 2 questions to ask ourselves as we move through this Lenten season. First, will you obey God's call to share His good news, which He has entrusted to you, with those around you? And second, with whom does he want you to share it today?

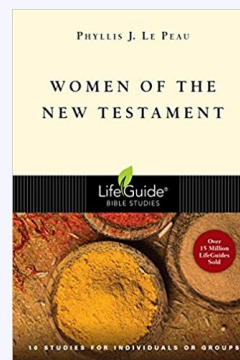

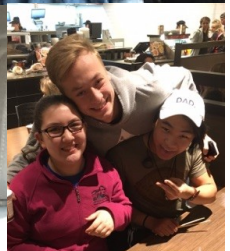

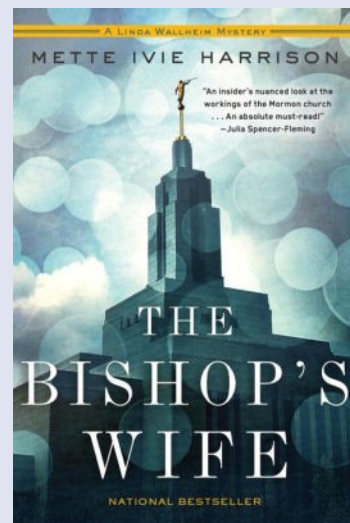

Sensible Ladies Book Club



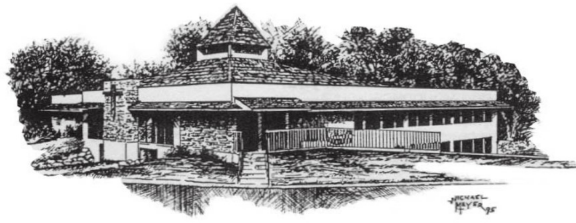
