Belong by Pastor Steve Larson

n the time of Ezra and Nehemiah, around ■ 440 BC, a group from within Israel formed in order to guard the righteousness of God's People and protect them from diluting their culture. They called themselves

the Nivdalim. "those who had separated themselves". Whenever Israel began to blend with the cultures around them, the Nivdalim would step in and remind them of all that made them holy, (literally meaning

"separate"), from the world around them. In the times between the Old and New Testaments, when Israel was once again courting Rome and becoming more Roman than Jewish, the Nivdalim ioined with the Maccabees to drive off the Romans and hold Israel together. And when the Maccabees themselves became too worldly, it was the Nivdalim who called them to account. We know the Nivdalim by their Aramaic name, "Perishuth" or Pharisee.

The message of the Pharisees has always been,

The message of Jesus has always been,

"You are a sinner so you belong."

> "You are a sinner so you don't belong." While holding tight the boundaries of God's People, the Pharisees began to exclude anything and anyone they deemed worldly who might influence the righteous away from following God wholeheartedly. But this is a dangerous practice, one with which Jesus had some serious problems. In fact, the

Pharisees were one of the only groups that Jesus treated as an enemy.

You see, the message of Jesus has always been, "You are a sinner so you belong." Whether talking to a leper, a prostitute, a violent political revolutionary, a traitorous tax collector, or even a Pharisee, Jesus' message was always the same: "You are a sinner so vou belong." In fact, for Jesus, belonging always seemed to precede believing. His call was always "come and follow me" first, and "obey all I have commanded" second. "Neither do I condemn you" first, and "go and sin no more" second.

Which message do we give this world around us?




