verywhere Paul planted a church on his three missionary journeys, he required the same thing. Each church was unique and each letter Paul wrote was unique, but there was a common requirement for each – stewardship. At every church Paul founded, they were taught to give their offerings so that he could bring these gifts back to the poor

Christians in Jerusalem. He recognized that some of these newly created churches were not well off, so he didn't demand an amount but rather an attitude, a generosity toward others across the world.

It is a bit ironic that it was the Corinthians who balked at this for financial reasons. Corinth, strategically placed at the crossroads of commerce — both the North/South and East/ West routes passed through it — was one of the wealthiest cities in the world at that time. But then, isn't it usually the poor who give most freely of

Paul, with a bit of irony himself, tells them that he doesn't want them to be too put out by their gifts to the poor in Jerusalem. Instead, he says, the goal is equality, not in our American, democratic sense but in terms of resources. That, he says, should be our Christian goal when it comes to money, housing, and any other re-

Silent Directed Retreat at CPBC: Sept 14-16, 2018! The theme of the 2018 Silent Directed Retreat is *Praying With Henri Nouwen*.

Nouwen (1932-1996) was a Dutch Catholic priest who spent his life in service as a professor, writer, and theologian. Along with teaching at Notre Dame and the divinity schools of Yale and Harvard. Nouwen was the author of 39 books. At various seasons of his life, he lived with the Trappist monks in the Abbey of Genesee, the poor in Peru, and the L'Arche Community in Trosly, France. In 1986 Nouwen moved to the Davbreak L'Arche Community near Toronto, Ontario, He spent his last 10 years in this community of individuals with developmental disabilities living with assistants.

Join us for the singing of Taize chants and talks that focus on some of Nouwen's themes in his writings, such as silence, solitude, and prayer. Our worship will conclude with lectio divina prayer with texts related to the theme. The weekend will include a private room for each participant with plenty of space for silence and solitude. There will be times of worship and opportunities to meet with a spiritual director.

VOLUNTEER OPPORTUNITIES FOR WINCHESTER HOUSE!


