Generosity by Pastor Steve Larson

dear friend of mine passed away 5 years ago and at his funeral, his kids put together a short booklet of his "famous sayings". Some were funny, some poignant, some were "just him", but all brought a memory, a tear, or a good chuckle. I was not surprised at the number that revolved around money, for my friend was well known for his conservative ("tight fisted" some said) approach to

But what I learned through both the

money.

booklet and his family's reflections was that his "tightfistedness" was not a matter of hoarding, or self-security, or political opinion. Rather, every penny he saved was one more penny he could give to the poor, a worthwhile ministry, or a church member in need. I was humbled by this man's incredibly generous

In the church, we agree that all we have comes from God and ultimately belongs to God, and we try to ask, "what would God have me do with



this free hour, with this mathematical mind, with my salary?" But often we think of generosity as a to-do list we can accomplish rather than a state of mind. We think that if we give our 10% (or by most surveys of American Christianity more

like 2.6%) to anything we can determine as a Christian ministry, and we give God an hour on Sunday morning, then we've accomplished "generosity". But as my dear friend taught me, each aspect of our lives needs to be flavored with generosity. How we talk about people needs to be generous, which will put an end to our gossip. What we do on Saturday needs to be generous, and not just to our families or ourselves, but to those in need of Jesus. And yes, our family budgets and spending need to be generous, with the first 10% of every dollar that enters our house going to our local church, and then more to support mission work, and then the rest prayed over as to how God would have us spend His money.

Generosity is a way of life, not a to-do list to be accomplished. But ultimately, it is a countercultural way for us to reflect the character of a God who creates, who gives, who unites, and who entrusts us with His bank account to spend as He sees fit. Anything less is a missed evangelistic opportunity.





Dear Brothers and Sisters,

We never like to send these types of letters, but knew it was to bring you up to speed on finances at LCC. Through August, our general giving is \$93,000 behind budget. Our spending has been contained so that we have an overall year-to-date deficit (i.e., giving less spending) of (\$86,000). While it is normal for us to operate in a deficit for much of the year, especially during the summer where attendance and giving is historically lower, we were forced to borrow \$8,000 from our restricted funds to meet operating expenses in August. This is not good.

As you are probably aware, God's people have a history of coming together at year end where December is always our largest month of giving. This creates a cash surplus that we deplete throughout the following year to pay operations while we operate in a deficit. Rest assured, this phenomenon is not unique to LCC. Having to borrow \$8,000 from our restricted funds means we fully depleted our cash surplus from 2017 year-end.

With 3 full months left in the year, we are confident that God's people will heed the call and continue to give generously to Libertyville Covenant Church and the Kingdom of God. We need to bring in \$200,000 during these months in order to meet our annual budget. Thank you in advance for your prayerful consideration in giving to LCC.

To help make the giving process simpler, Libertyville Covenant Church is pleased to announce the introduction of an electronic option for making offerings. Contributions can now be debited automatically from your checking or savings account (as an ACH) or processed using your credit or debit card. On a practical level, we recognize that forms of payment have steadily evolved from cash to checks to card based transactions. Many people primarily manage their finances online. Providing the means to support our ministry through online giving has become a priority. Furthermore, online giving is a powerful way to faithfully offer your gifts. It provides you another way to be consistent, disciplined and faithful with God's resources.

For each online gift you make, you will receive a receipt via email. From the website and your account, you can "View Your Donations", however, the official giving to LCC will be the traditional year-end giving statement. Watch for more details soon on how to give electronically!


