God's Stuff

Our Vision Statement, the means by which we carry out or mission of Growing Disciples, Growing the Church, and Growing the Kingdom of God, states that we do this through teaching and praise, through service and sharing, through loving and giving. To help us figure out how to live out this Vision statement, we will be focusing on a different piece of this statement at different times each year. This fall, with the conclusion of our three-year capital campaign, we thought it fitting that we should focus on our giving. The theological word for this is Stewardship.

Probably the best-known verse in all of scripture, the gospel in one short statement, John 3:16 has shown up everywhere from sermons to sporting events. And the key word of this verse is "gave". God loved us so

much that He gave us Jesus. Generosity, giving, is part of the very nature of God. This is not usually what we consider when we think about Stewardship. We usually think of stewardship as (1) a financial issue, and (2) a matter of duty.

Due to a glut of sermons on what to do with our money (give it to the church), we

have been conditioned to think of stewardship as strictly, or at best primarily, a financial issue. But it is not. Stewardship is, as the Covenant once put it, "God's people using God's stuff to accomplish God's purposes." We are God's people and have been given a lot of stuff by God. Yes, money is

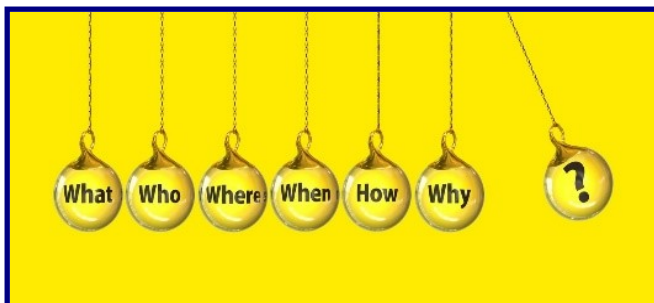
one thing God has given us but so are our houses, families, friends, neighborhoods, abilities, experiences, and even time itself. When we begin to see everything we have as a gift from God, we begin to see that we don't own any of it. We are simply the ones charged by God with using His stuff as He would want us to.

These same sermons have appealed to our sense of duty when it comes to our giving. We give because we "should" or because "we owe it to God." This is where our Tithing language comes from - we owe God 10% of our money, with the false implication that the rest is ours to use as we wish. Instead, stewardship is about reflecting the character of God, being more Godly, by living life generously. When we become like God in this area, we become generous people, who desire to give rather than hoard or shop or gamble God's gifts away.

So as we consider how we as a church can Grow through our stewardship, consider God's generosity. Can we give freely and sacrificially to others, to God's mission, to our church, and to each other as a means of discipleship? Can we try to break the hold money has on us by giving 1% more away this year than we did last year? Can we be the source of God's blessing for others rather than seeking that blessing for ourselves?

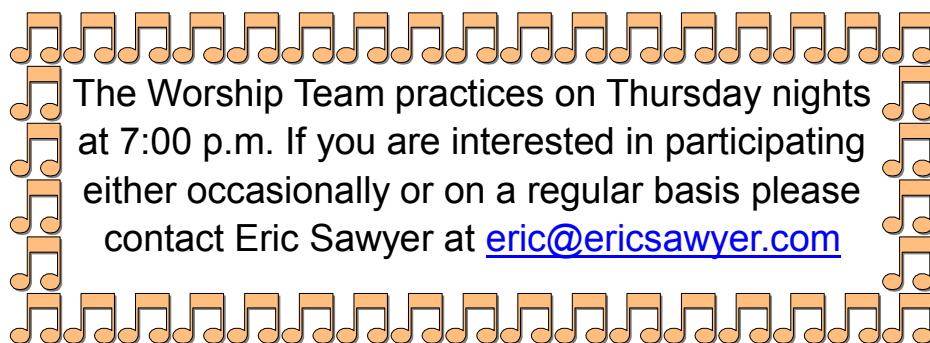

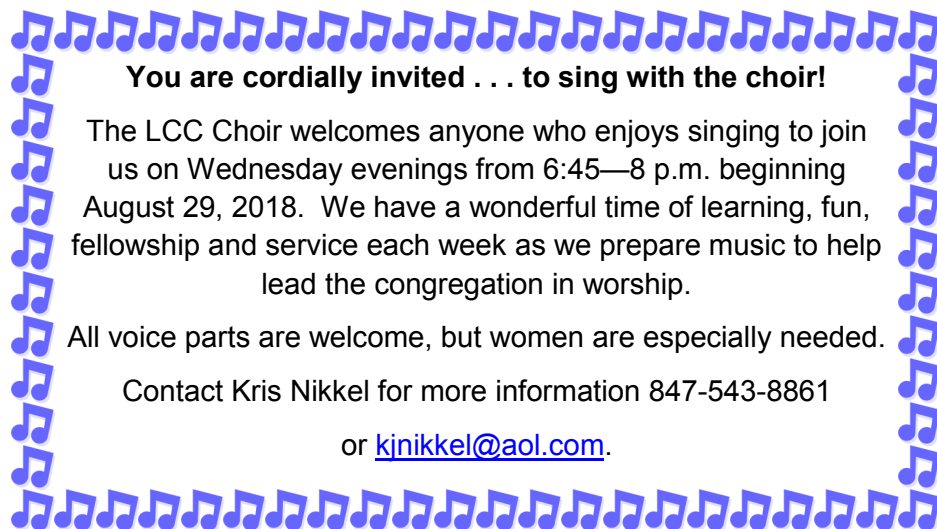

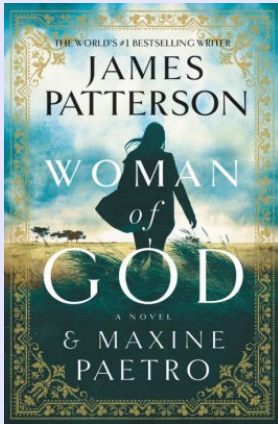

Silent Directed Retreat at CPBC: Sept 14-16, 2018!

The theme of the 2018 Silent Directed Retreat is ***Praying With Henri Nouwen***.

Nouwen (1932-1996) was a Dutch Catholic priest who spent his life in service as a professor, writer, and theologian. Along with teaching at Notre Dame and the divinity schools of Yale and Harvard, Nouwen was the author of 39 books. At various seasons of his life, he lived with the Trappist monks in the Abbey of Genesee, the poor in Peru, and the L'Arche Community in Trosly, France. In 1986 Nouwen moved to the Daybreak L'Arche Community near Toronto, Ontario. He spent his last 10 years in this community of individuals with developmental disabilities living with assistants.

Join us for the singing of Taize chants and talks that focus on some of Nouwen's themes in his writings, such as **silence, solitude, and prayer**. Our worship will conclude with lectio divina prayer with texts related to the theme. The weekend will include a private room for each participant with plenty of space for silence and solitude. There will be times of worship and opportunities to meet with a spiritual director.
