was 18, a suburban boy, and stranded alone in Chicago. My first experience at North Park was one of deep loneliness, with my expected roommate and best friend an exchange student in Mexico, my homebased friends off without me, my family leaning on me for strength, my confidence shattered, and my stress level through the roof. I felt lost, and had no hope for

out of my door, I witnessed a group of about 15 people I had met at Orientation laughing and grabbing people left and right to join them on their march. They saw me before I could duck back inside and their leaders Mike and Arwen shouted, "Steve, come on!" I had no choice but to join the throng and follow as they walked the last hall of Sohlberg and then down Foster Avenue to Immanuel Covenant Church to begin a college age bible study that would become my home for the next 4 years.



Because of that simple invitation, I quickly found a group of friends who would become my soulmates for life, three of whom I will we camp-

ing with next week, 30 years after the invitation. I found a church that would be my training ground for ministry, where Heather and I would be married 7 years after the invitation. That simple invitation changed my life and made me the man, the Christian, and the pastor that I am today. And I can say that without exaggeration.

What if we at LCC could share an invitation like that? What if you, today, right where you are, could share an invitation that would shape someone's life in God's image forever? What if we weren't too afraid, too distracted, too busy, or too complacent to change, or even have a part in saving, someone else's life today? What if LCC had a Culture of Invitation and saw new people experiencing Jesus every week? How big would God's smile be?



Book Review: Jim and Caspar Go to Church

Jim Henderson made national news by "buying" an atheist on Ebay for \$504. What began as a search for a "secret shopper" for his church, an atheist who would share their unvarnished opinion of his church's evangelism efforts, became a headline story. And this caused Jim to ponder what it would be like to visit other churches with an atheist to get their unvarnished opinion of Christianity as a whole. Matt Caspar took the challenge and the end result was a book that I have mentioned in sermons and that our pastoral leadership team has read and discussed together.



For a year, Jim and Caspar visited one church a month, attending famous mega-churches like Willow and Saddleback, hearing famous preachers like Osteen and T.D. Jakes, but also experiencing emergent congregations, house churches, and even a regular, small, Presbyterian church with little claim to fame. Each chapter of this book is this their story of their visit, and the ensuing conversation between a pastor and an atheist about what was attractive about the church and what was a big turn off.

It is easy as Christians to become defensive in reading this book, blaming opinions on upbringing, assumptions, or a lack of Spirit-filled grace. But one cannot avoid the hard conclusions. Whether Caspar's disdain of smoke machines and lights shows, Jim's chagrin at the sheer volume of "churchy language", or their shared confusion over the use of church funds, the lessons are there for every church with a bit of contextualization.

But there are plenty of good encouragements as well. Caspar, a rock musician by hobby, was deeply drawn to the traditional, organ-led and unassuming Presbyterian church, sharing that it reminded him so much of the church in which he grew up. He was also intrigued by every church that put their message into action. One urban church was extremely hard for them to find, yet they noted that they passed a number of community aid organizations with the church's name on it as they searched.

Yet I believe it was the final conclusion that sticks with me. "Is this really what you guys think Jesus asked you to do?" When did Jesus call us to slick, professional worship sets, gaudy buildings and even "campuses", and gem-encrusted jets? And where is the self-sacrifice, the love and open welcome, the authenticity that we see in the bible? Together, Jim and Caspar fairly critique the face of Christendom in our culture and find it lacking. Yet they also give hope for a relevant, Godly, Spirit-led community to which Jesus called us.

Spiritual Direction

is a ministry of holy listening, prayer and discernment in a confidential setting of encouragement for persons

- who are seeking to grow in their relationship with God
- who are wanting an opportunity to focus on God's presence and working in his or her life
- who would like the companionship of another person with whom to reflect on what they are hearing from and experiencing with God.

Through this ministry a person, known as a directee, has a spiritual companion, known as a spiritual director, who listens to the stories of your life and help to discern the present working of the Spirit of God

- in a prayerful environment
- believing that God is acting in every area of one's life
- trusting in the transforming power of God's love.

Spiritual direction is not

- counseling
- advice giving
- problem solving.

Spiritual direction is a 50 minutes conversation in which a person is helped to hear his or her own story and come to a clearer understanding of how God is working in his or her life. In one book written about spiritual direction, the authors define spiritual direction "as help given by one Christian to another which enables that person to pay attention to God's personal communication to him or her, to respond to this personally communicating God, to grow in intimacy with this God, and to live out the consequences of the relationship."

The purpose of spiritual direction is that those who enter into it will grow closer to God and become more the person God created them to be in Jesus Christ.

One directee wrote of spiritual direction....

I've met God countless times in spiritual direction. I first began meeting with a spiritual director during a particularly confusing and difficult season of my life. The clarifying awareness of Christ's peace and presence in me was immensely comforting and served as a guiding light. Since then I have found regular times of direction to be an indispensable part of my spiritual life. It has been extremely helpful to have a director — a fellow traveler on the journey — offering another set of ears to help me listen to what God is doing in my life.

Several spiritual directors will be available at the February 16th "Unhurried Retreat". Sign up is required and limited, and needs to be completed by February 6th. Call the church office if you want a spot.


