As a boy, my friends and I would gather at Paul's house and play Army in his basement. Being the late 70's, we were always fighting "the Soviets" and they "were coming"! We'd make battle plans, find the best sticks for guns, and then charge out of the foxhole (his old overturned couch) and storm the enemy. Steve always did so gloriously and won every time. Paul always got shot and died a hero. I usually tended to Paul and cheered on Steve. And this was serious business for us, the cause of many fights and arguments between us... until, that was, "Paul, time for dinner!" When mom called, the fun was done and we went home and tended to Real Life.

We eventually outgrew Army and took to Street Hockey. Mike had all the equipment from his brother who seemed headed for the NHL, and all the kids on the street came out to play. And

this was serious business for us, the cause of many fights and arguments about missed calls, bent rules... until, that was, "Steve, the streetlights are on!" Streetlights always marked the end of our day. We'd throw everything into Mike's yard and head home, forgetting the current argument to tend to Real Life.

Far too many people in our Western culture are Playing Church. While we're there, it seems so important to us, the cause of many fights and arguments about mission and theology and the bible. But then we head home to tend to Real Life, to kids schedules and family schedules and our schedules, to work and vacations, to politics and news and Facebook. And

This Playing Church that we hear about around the Western world is the exact antithesis of True Discipleship. When Jesus called His disciples, they dropped everything to follow Him. And He was their life from then on. Jesus didn't demand that they give it all up to follow Him; they did it voluntarily, because that is what discipleship meant... and means. When we choose to follow Jesus, we give up everything else, and He becomes our life from then on. And in True Discipleship we find that what we receive is far greater than what we give up.

What areas of your life are the easiest to give up in order to be a True Disciple of Jesus? In what ways do you find yourself Playing Church? How might you stretch yourself this year to give up more of what this world offers in order to be free to receive all that Jesus offers? How might you Grow this year as a True Disciple?

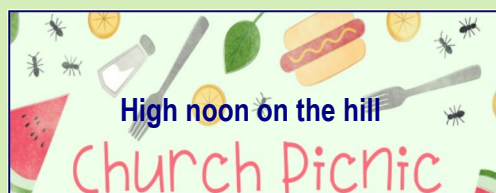

Book Review: "Covenant Roots"

Edited by Glenn P. Anderson

It is always beneficial to go back to the basics and remember your past. Though we live in a world that far too often ignores its past, we are called to remember "from whence we came". Throughout scripture, from the Exodus through the Lord's Supper, we are commanded by God to remember our past before we strive too far into the future.

"Covenant Roots" is a collection of writings from the very founding of our denomination. Beginning with the minutes of the very first Annual Meeting in 1885, Anderson has collected short documents spelling out who the Evangelical Covenant Church first intended itself to be. With writings by Mellander and Bowman, Waldenstrom and Nyvall, Anderson has compiled a history of intention from the beginnings of our church.

The pastors of our church read this together over the past few months and we had some very interesting reactions. The writing, often translated from Swedish, was a bit dry, and the main points were quite repetitive, but we were also shocked at the resonance we felt between the issues they faced at the outset and all we face today. Issues of identity and unity were the main issues in 1885 just as they are today. Whether that means we have not learned in the past 150 years or that the issues are inherent in our system is for each of us to decide.

The Covenant is intentionally non-Creedal. This means that while we recognize the great creeds of the Church as useful tools, we do not recognize them as authoritative to our lives. It also means that we have not defined ourselves with boundaries and limits because, as David Nyvall states, "(Creeds) are war methods. They are the front lines of battle." Instead, "The New Testament is not avowedly a guide to correct thinking, to proper conduct, though favorable to both. It is a live testimony of faith in Christ for the avowed purpose of winning and keeping souls for Him." This caused and causes us much consternation when we try to define what we believe, but from our beginning we have insisted that the only true statement of beliefs is the New Testament itself. This is our Creed, and all others are simply human restatements of its principles.

Being non-creedal, the Covenant is also a ripe field for conflict. We all like nice clear boundaries, statements with which we can agree or not. And so without these crisp lines of demarcation, the Covenant is always in danger of division. Trying to hold together different groups who believe differently about points of theology, whether atonement theory, baptism, women in ministry, or human sexuality, has proven to be difficult at best, and impossible at worst. Yet still we stand, and we stand together. And that is saying something in our increasingly polarized world. It is our greatest difficulty, and our greatest strength.

The Covenant seeks to be an open door to Christ, "wide enough to let in anyone who seeks to follow Jesus, but narrow enough to exclude anyone who does not." This causes disagreements and divisions, and all the more so today as we continue to lose the ability to listen and learn from one another. But it is the way Jesus lived His life, and so we continue to faithfully, if haltingly, follow in His steps.

Adult Sunday School

Welcome to Adult Sunday School! This year, our Pastoral Staff and Council/Leadership Team have decided to more deeply explore the theme of **"To Grow Disciples" – the first element of our LCC Mission Statement**. Our hope is to begin an annual process, exploring a general theme for each year - a common focus that can then infuse our various ministries within LCC. In adult Sunday School, this means that we will be exploring various dimensions of "Discipleship" – exploring together what it means to "become" a Disciple and what it looks like to then "make" other Disciples.

On Sunday August 18th, we will begin with a common time for all ages – celebrating the kickoff of the Sunday School year. We will then welcome Jesse and Emily Ciccotti who will be in town for a time of sharing around their own ministry / Discipleship. The last part of the session will provide a roadmap for the Fall Adult Class.

On the 25th we will explore the basics of Discipleship together in a shared discussion. This will be done through watching and discussing the Rob Bell video "Dust". This is the same process the Council and Pastoral Staff went through during a wonderful June offsite - exploring the basics of Discipleship together. We look forward to this time of framing our year together. After the 25th, we will be introducing a 4-week Discipleship series, details to come. We look forward to a wonderful year of Adult Sunday School together!

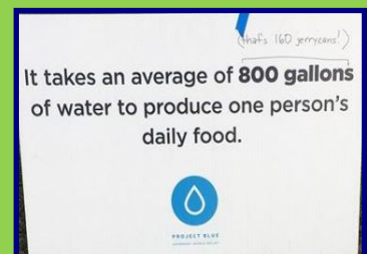

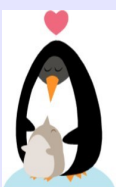
There were a lot of smiling faces at camp a few weeks ago . . . Especially when Pastor Paul came for a visit and brought cookies.

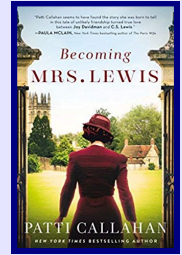
