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"HOPE"

"Blessed are those who grieve, for they shall be comforted." - Matt. 5:4

Death, Burial, Resurrection. This is the natural path of things in the Christian life. Our hope is in the reality of this path, that death which feels so final, and burial which confirms it in our minds, always leads to resurrection which has the final word. In the past few days, and months, and years we have claimed this truth in our own church, as we've lost close fathers, husbands, and friends to death. We have claimed this truth that though they have died, and been buried, we know that their final destination is not the grave but the Resurrection life Jesus promised. And we claim that truth for ourselves as well, that death is never the end for us but only a step on the path to resurrection.

In our culture, we face the shock of death regularly. COVID has driven this home by taking over 5.5 million people off this globe in the last few years. In our church, we proclaim the hope of resurrection just as often. Our songs, prayers, and scriptures proclaim this every week. But we have a very hard time with the grief of burial. We all tend to want to build a bridge right from death to resurrection and bypass the grief of burial. But this is not the path, nor is it healthy, nor is it biblical.

When Jesus lost his close friend Lazarus to death, He of all people could have just jumped from death the resurrection. But instead, Jesus went to the burial of Lazarus, joined with Mary and Martha, Lazarus' sisters, and

grieved. In fact, Jesus wept with them. Why? Jesus could have just rolled back the stone and resurrected Lazarus, a foreshadowing of His own resurrection we proclaim each week. But He didn't because that is not the path. Death, Burial, Resurrection. Even when we know that resurrection is coming, we still need to grieve.

In fact, when we try to build a bridge directly from death to resurrection, bypassing the grief of burial altogether, that grief will come to us anyway. But now it will show up in unhealthy ways like bitterness and resentment and numbing behaviors. Grief undealt-with is a very dangerous thing, because though it feels easier not to deal with grief, that is not the path.

As we face the death of many in our congregation recently, we can take the time to grieve together, for that is our path. And that grieving takes a while. So as we grieve Paul and Phil, Jeff and Dan, John and so many others we've lost, we have the gift of community where we can share our grief. So share your memories, shed your tears, and let yourself grieve. Grief is a healthy thing, especially when it is seen as part of the path to resurrection.

Check-in begins at 7:00 PM on Friday, with our first gathering at 8:00 PM.




Save the Date! March 5th, 9am – 1pm




SENSIBLE LADIES BOOK GROUP

March 11th, Friday at 7:00 p.m.

This historical fiction novel traces what happens to children placed up for adoption through the Tennessee Children's Home Society in the late 1930s. Georgia Tann was the head of this orphanage and the novel is based upon her real-life experiences. Be prepared to have your heart broken for these children! But also be prepared to read a story of hope, tenacity and love!





Welcome to our Immerse Spring Program! This year, our Immerse reading program will run from *January 31st through May 22nd* (16 weeks). During this time, we will commit to reading the entire New Testament – Matthew through Revelation – together using the "Immerse: Messiah" books. Each week, there are 5 days (Monday-Friday) of readings (about 4 pages or 10-15 minutes a day) to be completed at your own pace. Click <u>here</u> for the sixteen-week reading plan.

We have three formats for reading Immerse:

- 1. Hard copy: You can purchase a book at church for \$15 (or less if money is a hinderance; we don't want finances to be a factor). This year, we also have large print and Spanish copies available!
- 2. Free MP3 audio: Click <u>here</u> (once on Immerse website-click "view 16-week audio button)
- 1. E-book: Purchase through the following vendors: <u>Amazon, Apple, Christianbook.com, Barnes and Noble, Kobo, Google Play</u>

If you choose to be a part of an Immerse Study Group, then your group will be between 5-12 people meeting weekly to discuss what was read. These meetings are less like a Bible study but more like a "book club."

How Can I Participate In A Group?

- 1. Join an existing group we have many already set to meet. Contact the church office to sign up.
- 2. Form Your Own "Immerse" Group feel free to start your own group! Gather a group of 5-12 people—friends, neighbors, acquaintances, or colleagues. You can meet at your home, at a coffee shop, over lunch, wherever and whenever works for you. Hosting a group is simple: Immerse has a host guide here.
- 3. Do Immerse as a family A family guide is available $\underline{\text{here}}$ to use at home for parents, grandparents, or guardians to use with younger children.
