Crowns

Whenever the living creatures give glory, honor and thanks to him who sits on the throne and who lives for ever and ever, the twenty-four elders fall down before him who sits on the throne and worship him who lives for ever and ever. They lay their crowns before the throne and say, "You are worthy, our Lord and God, to receive glory and honor and power, for you created all things, and by your will they were created and have their being." - Rev. 4:9-11

What does it mean to wear a crown? Crowns symbolize victory – winners in the Games would receive a laurel crown, like today's gold medal. Crowns symbolize power – a king who overthrew another took his crown as a means of taking away his power. Crowns symbolize royalty – only royalty could wear a crown and anyone caught wearing one who shouldn't was killed. Crowns even symbolize achievement – Paul calls the Philippian church his crown, and we talk about someone's "crowning achievement". Crowns are immense symbols of worth.

So what does it mean to lay your crown before someone else? Imagine the statement it makes when someone willingly lays their own crown at the feet of another! It means giving someone else all your worth, your victories, your authority, and your achievements. It means humility to the greatest degree. It means acknowledging someone else as worth more than all you've achieved.

Which crown do we usually give to Jesus? As we live out our faith day to day, do we offer Him a parody of ourselves, a crown that is not really a crown at all? Or do we offer Him our very best, our very selves?

As we prepare ourselves this month to celebrate Resurrection Sunday, let's take a cue from the 24 Elders who worship eternally at the throne of God and lay our "crowns" before God in worship. How might you offer your victories, your power, your authority, and your achievements to God, both past and present? Whatever that may look like for you, give God all of who you are in every moment, not just in Lent but always.


WORSHIP in April...

Over the summer, Pastor Steve will be taking sabbatical leave from LCC.

What is a sabbatical? Sabbatical comes from the word Sabbath, a concept taught in scripture to remind us that we are not essential to ministry nor in control, but that God is both. Jesus modeled a pattern of ministry with periodic times of rest. A pastoral sabbatical is not vacation, nor is it study leave. Sabbaticals can include prayer, rest, study, travel, solitude, and family time. It embodies the idea that the teacher needs to become a student again and that professional clergy once again need to be simply worshippers.

How was this sabbatical granted? The Covenant denomination and conference support the use of sabbaticals as tools for reflection and revitalization for pastors. In the Letter of Call for each of LCC's pastors, a sabbatical is provided after seven years of ministry. (Steve's sabbatical was postponed a year because of the pandemic.) Sabbaticals need to be carefully planned, both for the pastor's time away and for the congregation in their absence. To this end, LCC has a sabbatical committee working with the pastors on this two-pronged planning. Pastor Steve will be sharing the details of his plans in an upcoming meeting which will include Q&A. The congregation is called upon to learn about Steve's sabbatical as details emerge so that they may pray for him through this important time.

How will Steve's sabbatical affect the congregation? One of the hopes for a sabbatical is that renewed energy, creativity, and perspective will be gained. This hope is not only for the pastor, but for the congregation, as it has opportunities to step into leadership differently and exercise different muscles as a community. Also, a temporary change in "how we do things" allows for fresh eyes on various aspects of the church's ministry, highlighting things that need improvement.

Ultimately, a sabbatical is an act of faith that God will guide both Pastor and congregation into new energy, spiritual vision and rediscovered zeal for shared ministry.

Mission of the Month

Recap of 3/13/2022 Mission Moment

PADS has come a long way since they were founded in 1972 – with only a 24-hour telephone crisis hotline. Step by step they have managed to build an organization capable of giving hundreds of those in need either emergency shelter, temporary shelter or permanent housing.

All those who contact them meet with a case manager who teaches them how to utilize their emergency shelter system; assesses them for need and what programs and services would be appropriate for them; and provides access to basic needs – like a mailing address!

They also provide counseling services to support them in their journey OUT of homelessness and into housing.

Additionally, there is a Prevention & Diversion program which helps provide earlier intervention to those at risk of homelessness by working to keep them in their current housing.

A large car full of items from the PADS Wish List was delivered to their Waukegan office on Wednesday, March 23rd. Two very nice helpers happily unloaded everything and brought the items into the PADS building. They were excited when I told them everything was from a wish list provided to us. In addition, I received a voice mail from one of the managers who expressed immense gratitude for the generosity of our church. The LCC family was extremely generous (as usual) and I am SO grateful that we are quick to help those in need

Just another reminder - on Wednesday, March 30th with the help of Jr. High Youth, we will be setting up beds, serving dinner to PADS guests and providing lunches for the following day. On April 27th, the Sr. High Youth will provide the same services.




Our next book selection is Maisie Dobbs by Jacqueline Winspear

The book that introduced the world to the intuitive, intelligent, and resourceful heroine Maisie Dobbs-one of literature's favorite sleuths! Maisie Dobbs entered domestic service in 1910 at thirteen, working for Lady Rowan Compton. When her remarkable intelligence is discovered by her employer, Maisie becomes the pupil of Maurice Blanche, a learned friend of the Comptons. In 1929, following an apprenticeship with Blanche, Maisie hangs out her shingle: M. Dobbs, Trade and Personal Investigations. She soon becomes enmeshed in a mystery surrounding The Retreat, a reclusive community of

wounded World War I veterans. At first, Maisie only suspects foul play, but she must act quickly when Lady Rowan's son decides to sign away his fortune and take refuge there. Maisie hurriedly investigates, uncovering a disturbing mystery, which, in an astonishing denouement, gives Maisie the courage to confront a ghost that has haunted her for years.

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

Winter Camp 2022: "PANORAMIC"

2 Corinthians 4:18 "Because we look not at what can be seen but at what cannot be seen; for what can be seen is temporary, but what cannot be seen is eternal."



All that gathered focused on the reality that God sees everything in the world, even that which we cannot see. God is everywhere, present with every single person, even when we can't see it. God also doesn't just see what is happening in the here and now, but sees things that have happened before us and things that are to come. However, oftentimes we get caught up in just what we can see in front of us and forget to see the bigger picture. We allow ourselves to live in the moment and fail to look beyond our limited perspective. Only looking at the things around us and the things we are experiencing limits us from seeing God's viewpoint is far greater than ours. Instead, when we set our eyes on God we can begin to learn about his complete and holy panoramic view of the whole world. Much like the pictures we look at, there is way more to a picture than what we first see. When we step back, the panoramic view comes more into focus. In doing so, our perspective was broadened in hearing from eight missionaries around the world as they shared how God was at work in their context. While students drew deeper in knowledge and

perspective of God they also grew in their relationship with one another. Students had all sorts of fun playing stump ball, "The Giant Swing", beating Pastor Paul in a game of horse, playing "the game", archery, eating all sorts of candy, and simply being together. We pray that the world will be a different place this week because of what God did through this weekend. And we pray each student leaves this place equipped and excited to pursue knowing God and his panoramic view.


