# Sabbaticals for Everyone!

"And on the seventh day God rested from all His work..." – Gen. 2:2

"Bear in mind that the Lord has given you the Sabbath; that is why on the sixth day he gives you bread for two days. Everyone is to stay where they are on the seventh day; no one is to go out." So the people rested on the seventh day." -Ex. 16:29-30

"Remember the Sabbath day by keeping it holy. Six days you shall labor and do all your work, but the seventh day is a sabbath to the Lord your God. On it you shall not do any work..." – Ex. 20:8-10

The most common reflection I've heard when thinking back over the pandemic and looking for a silver lining is some form of, "I found out how nice it was to have time to rest, be with family, and take time for myself." We are a society run ragged. 60 hour work weeks are more the norm than an oddity. Family meals together are a thing of the past, and even sitting down while we eat is uncommon. We double our work as often as possible so we can accomplish more in a day. We scoff at European nations that are calling for shorter work weeks, more vacation time, and more flexible hours.

And though our lack of rest breaks one of the 10 Commandments (!), we justify our workaholism with Jesus' words that the sabbath was made for us, not us for the sabbath. We disguise our addiction to busyness as 'supporting my family', or 'what it takes to be successful at work' or 'the cost of a comfortable living'.

There's a reason God established the Sabbath at the end of the week. Biologically, emotionally, spiritually, and personally, we need a regular break in our week, year, and life, not to add more work but to simply rest. And while the 10 Commandments make Sabbath a law, it is at it's root a gift. Imagine the Creator and Ruler of the Universe demanding of you... that you take a nap! Play with your kids! Reflect on the week you just experienced and the one to come! Spend some time with Him in prayer!

And while our week needs a Sabbath day ("Shabbat" in Hebrew), so do our lives. The idea of a Sabbatical is that every 7 years you give yourself, your land, your family, and your workers an extended time of rest and reflection. And then every 7 Sabbaticals (or 49 years for we who are math-challenged!) the entire community had a Year of Jubilee, a year when debts were canceled (wouldn't that be amazing!), land and servants were returned to their baseline, and society rebooted and started again.

Maybe we as a nation aren't going to have a Year of Jubilee. Maybe you can't take an extended period of time to get away, reflect, and study God's Word. But you can take a day each week to rest. It doesn't have to be Saturday or Sunday, but those are traditional. How would your life change, for the better and for the worse, if you refused to work your job, work around the house, or take your kids to practices and games, and just rested for a day. Play a board game. Ask a deep question and have the whole house answer. Enjoy a meal together without interruption. I guarantee you'd be healthier, less stressed, and stand out from those around you, which would be an amazing chance to share about Jesus.

And if "Sabbath" is too churchy a word, or has too much baggage with it, just tell people you're taking a one-day sabbatical. You'll be glad you did!

Jill's House is a Christian not-for-profit organization that serves families who have children with intellectual disabilities. Their main facility is a 42,000+ square foot complex in Vienna, VA, where they provide daytime and overnight care services, but they also have weekend overnight camps that serve families in Chicago, Nashville, Seattle and New Jersey.

The primary purpose of Jill's House is to provide overnight respite for the parents and families of these special kids. In addition to the day to day struggles that we all face, they have the added concern, stress and

exhaustion that comes with raising a child with special needs. Studies have shown that these pressures lead to 150%+ higher rates of depression and 80%+ higher rates of divorce – it is a lot for anyone to handle, especially 24/7, 365 days a year.

Providing a safe and secure environment for their child gives these families a little time away to focus on themselves and their marriage, devote more time to their other children, or just be stress free for a little while. To recharge and renew themselves. And it also gives the child a special weekend away, where they can interact with other kids and experience new and fun activities.

Joel and Hannah Dillon attended LCC and were actively involved here when Joel was tapped to be President and CEO of Jill's House in 2015 and they moved to northern Virginia. A few years later, as Jill's House dreamed of a Chicagoland Weekend Adventures program, Joel reached out to LCC to gauge our interest (an enthusiastic yes!) and by June of 2018 Jill's House Windy City was up and running in partnership with LCC and Covenant Harbor.

At the outset, LCC was the drop-off and pick-up point for camp – our volunteers spent time with the kids while the parents were registering, helped tag and transfer luggage between the cars and our van, and got to know the families a bit while waiting for the entourage to leave for Covenant Harbor. However, due to COVID we no longer provide transport to camp and families now bring their child directly to Covenant Harbor.

So our primary role now is providing volunteers to be "Buddies" for the overnight camp weekends. Buddies arrive at Covenant Harbor at 5:30p on Friday night and are there through lunch on Sunday. Each Buddy is assigned one camper and will help make sure they stay safe and have a fun filled weekend. The Jill's House staff takes care of all medical and personal hygiene needs of the campers (bathroom breaks, showering, brushing teeth, etc.) as well as putting them to bed and getting them up and ready in the mornings.

Jill's House Windy City is growing – they are now up to 6 campouts per year and can accommodate up to 10 campers per weekend. Their biggest constraint is having enough Buddies – if there are not enough volunteers, some campers will have to be turned away. Being a Buddy is fun AND rewarding! It is something you can do alone, or with a friend, a neighbor, a co-worker, a spouse, one of your children (just need to be 16 or older) – anyone you always wanted to spend some quality time with! Please consider the possibilities and these upcoming Jill's House dates:




Our next book selection is Maisie Dobbs by Jacqueline Winspear

The book that introduced the world to the intuitive, intelligent, and resourceful heroine Maisie Dobbs-one of literature's favorite sleuths! Maisie Dobbs entered domestic service in 1910 at thirteen, working for Lady Rowan Compton. When her remarkable intelligence is discovered by her employer, Maisie becomes the pupil of Maurice Blanche, a learned friend of the Comptons. In 1929, following an apprenticeship with Blanche, Maisie hangs out her shingle: M. Dobbs, Trade and Personal Investigations. She soon becomes enmeshed in a mystery surrounding The Retreat, a reclusive community of

wounded World War I veterans. At first, Maisie only suspects foul play, but she must act quickly when Lady Rowan's son decides to sign away his fortune and take refuge there. Maisie hurriedly investigates, uncovering a disturbing mystery, which, in an astonishing denouement, gives Maisie the courage to confront a ghost that has haunted her for years.




## **CHILDREN'S MINISTRIES:**
