# Mission of the Month

We have recently been learning much more about our great neighbors in North Chicago through the housing work of ReNew Communities (<u>www.renewcommunities.org</u>) and through its partnership with Transform Capital (<u>www.tccommunity.org</u>), a nonprofit started by our very own Paul Hawkinson.

Many of us have experienced the generational benefits offered by home and/or business ownership. We have also been fortunate to have access to market-rate loans that make these purchases not only possible, but attractive. And yet, so many deserving neighbors in disinvested local communities have long been caught between historic discrimination of large financial institutions and the ravages of payday lending. Transform Capital ("TC") was founded in 2020 to address this gap – igniting the generational potential of asset ownership by providing *Capital and Catalyst to Lift up (and learn from) our Neighbors*.

Co-Founders Paul Hawkinson, Frederick Tolbert, Mark Chassman, and Stephen Kawasaki came together in 2020, pairing decades of professional experience in banking, investment management, real estate, and media with a shared heart for *Investing in Human Flourishing*. While "Flourishing" is far more than economics, still economics matter. Consider that a ~7% return over 50 years is a 30x return on investment—returns that fund life experience, education, healthcare, and even a new cycle of generosity.

As a nonprofit *Lending Movement That Makes No Cents*, TC's funding base is 100% comprised of donated capital which is then deployed into market-rate home mortgage and business loans. Loan payments then "pay-it-forward", making ownership possible for another neighbor, and creating fully recyclable capital where clients become an integral part of serving their own neighbors.

And well beyond the loan transaction, TC then activates the full power of its growing movement to walk alongside neighbors over the long journey of ownership, providing support, coaching and encouragement. Being in relationship and proximity leads to transformation for all of us as we learn through the lens of our neighbors. Through innovation, and alongside the deep volunteer talents of a growing movement, TC operates with almost no operating cost—ensuring that all benefits fully inure to the community. In its first year of mission, TC funded over \$630,000 in loans in the amazing community of North Chicago, IL, with recurring income already covering 100% of operating costs. Many LCC members and friends have been engaging with ReNew and with TC. Reach out to Paul or Dan Frost to learn more, or to find out how you can engage!



### A guide to wisdom, authenticity, and bliss for women as they age by the author of *Reviving Ophelia*.

Women growing older contend with ageism, misogyny, and loss. Yet as Mary Pipher shows, most older women are deeply happy and filled with gratitude for the gifts of life. Their struggles help them grow into the authentic, empathetic, and wise people they have

always wanted to be.

In *Women Rowing North*, Pipher offers a timely examination of the cultural and developmental issues women face as they age. Drawing on her own experience as daughter, sister, mother, grandmother, caregiver, clinical psychologist, and cultural anthropologist, she explores ways women can cultivate resilient responses to the challenges they face. "If we can keep our wits about us, think clearly, and manage our emotions skillfully," Pipher writes, "we will experience a joyous time of our lives. If we have planned carefully and packed properly, if we have good maps and guides, the journey can be transcendent."


