"Alice has COVID." The news sent ripples through the group as we sat together in a circle in the lounge. We had gathered like this every day of our pilgrimage, 20 people sitting in a hodgepodge of chairs in a rough approximation of a circle. We gathered at 5:30pm every day to share how we had encountered God that day – through art or animals, nature or nourishment, prayer or praise. But today, the ripples of concern for Alice, worry for our own health, and fear about the very existence of the rest of our trip spread from that central point where the news had dropped. Stillness gone, peace replaced, and the all-too-familiar flutters of anxiety we thought we'd left at home were suddenly with us once again.

After so many days of stillness, REAL stillness before God, these 3 words were even more unwelcome than usual. We had heard from the Holy Spirit in miraculous ways, had shared our wisdom and our peace with each other,

and were growing real relationships between us. And now this. And the next day, another diagnosis. And then another, and another. And with each successive Positive – oh, how ironic that word felt each time we heard it and felt the Negative emotions grow – our fear, worry, and concern grew. We were in one of this world's "thin spaces", where the veil separating heaven and earth is unusually thin due to the constant rubbing of prayer for centuries. We were away from the success-driven, hectic-paced, divided and divisive culture of home. We were supposed to be protected here! And so with the fear and anxiety, as small seed of resentment began to grow.

We stopped sharing table-space for our meals, instead eating outside with good distance between us, or alone with God. We were constantly distracted by concern for our sick friends who had become so close in the last few days. We were asked not to be indoors except for our lodging called "The Bishop's House", including the Abbey where we had been worshipping twice each day. The Iona Community was kind and sympathetic, but understandably cautious around us now. And so our trip changed, morphing from a time away from the world's worries to yet another place unprotected from the ravages of illness, solitude, and fear.

I spent much time alone those last days. Hikes to the beaches, the peak of Dun-I, the solitude of the graveyard chapel, these became my trip. And even an introvert like me longed to be close to our group, because physical distance cannot help but become emotional distance as well. My resentment grew, not toward those with COVID on our trip – they and the other millions were not responsible for getting sick – but toward God. How could He let this happen? This was a literal once-in-a-lifetime chance for all of us, and now it was ruined. Thanks a lot, God.

And then the Spirit finally got through the resentment-blocked ears of my heart. "Ruined? How has this ruined your trip, Steve?" It was a gentle word, not scolding or angry. In it was a Father's care for a wounded child, and I welcomed the words like bread after a long fast. "Your trip's false perfection is ruined, it's true, but that was never from Me anyway. I am not giving you a perfect story to bring home to others. I am giving you experiences, relationships, opportunities to see Me more clearly than usual, to be Me to those around you, and to experience just a taste of the Kingdom of God. None of that has changed because of COVID. In fact, this change in your trip is just another opportunity for worship, for loving others, and for reflection. Don't lose the opportunity in your resentment that your plans have changed. Those weren't mine in the first place."

And just like that, gratitude became real in my heart, in our group, and in our discussions. We began identifying things we were grateful for rather than what was going wrong. And I learned a valuable lesson. Gratitude truly is independent of our circumstances. Whatever comes to us in life, no matter how hard, sad, scary, or joyful, is just another opportunity to love God, and love others, and watch God work. It is the contemplative way, the Celtic way, and the Christian way – to see God in all things, no matter what, and to love Him, love others, and grow. **Pastor Steve**

#### NO PROBLEM: A 4-WEEK STUDY FROM THE OLD & NEW TESTAMENT ON LOVING OTHERS



#### **SERIES OVERVIEW:**

Apologies — they're hard to give, but they're sometimes hard to receive, too. When you're the one who has hurt someone else, saying you're sorry (and actually meaning it) takes work and practice. But when you're the one who's been hurt by someone else, things get even more complicated. What if you don't want to forgive them? What if they don't seem sorry? What if they won't even admit they're

wrong? What if they've moved on, but you're still not over it? In this 4-week series from the Gospels, we'll find out what it means to truly give (and receive) forgiveness. We'll discover that when you need forgiveness, it's not enough to just apologize. And when you've been hurt and need to forgive, we'll explore the importance of shifting your perspective, remembering God forgave first, and remembering Jesus knows what it's like to be hurt.

## **COVENANT WORLD RELIEF and DEVELOPMENT**



### **Refugees of Economic Crisis**

A refugee crisis is often associated with war or natural disaster, but sometimes it is a socioeconomic situation that forces people to flee their home. Venezuela has suffered from hyperinflation for several years, the worst economic crisis for a country in peacetime in nearly a century. Severe shortages of basic food supplies, coupled with increasing crime and violence, have created a situation that is untenable for many citizens. More than 6 million Venezuelans have left their homeland under extreme duress, many traveling on foot to neighboring South American countries, including almost 2 million who have crossed into Colombia. Our partners in Colombia, the Covenant Social Foundation of the Atlantic (FUSPA), have witnessed this situation firsthand as entirely new communities of displaced Venezuelans are forming. Many arrive with nothing more than the clothes they are wearing. Thankfully, the leadership of FUSPA sees these newly arrived neighbors not as a strain on their economy but as gifted people who have much to offer their new community. FUSPA has responded by creating a program to help equip the displaced people with the essential resources—from documentation to community understanding to material assets—to build on their existing skills to establish small businesses and thrive in their new setting. One group of 20 women have begun selling coffee as street vendors in the city of Barranquilla. They already possessed a deep knowledge of coffee, and in partnership with FUSPA they are now equipped to put their ability into practice and significantly increase their ability to provide for their families.
