"Wait for the Lord. Be strong and take heart and wait for the Lord." –

Ps. 27:14

Waiting is a funny thing. It can strengthen us, or test us. It can be a welcomed friend or an obstacle to overcome. As we enter Advent together, we wait together. We wait for Jesus' return, promised again and again in scripture. Impatient, frustrated and lamenting, or excited, anticipating and preparing – we all wait differently, but we all wait. Together.

Our Sabbatical Team suggested using these articles to share my Sabbatical experiences, and this summer, my trip to Scotland taught me a lot about waiting. My first flight of the trip was delayed by 3 hours, and so I waited.


The delay caused me to miss my next flight and the next was not for 7 hours, so I waited. 14 days later my flight home was delayed by a week due to an unfortunate COVID diagnosis, so I waited. When the week passed and I finally could fly home, my flight was canceled and another needed to be booked, so I waited. When it was finally booked, it only took me to Philadelphia, not Chicago, so I had to book my own ticket for the final leg, and on the phone, I waited. My flight from London to Philly was delayed, and so I waited. And in Philly I met Customs, a 2 hour wait when I only had 1 ½ hours before my final flight. Thankfully, thunderstorms in Chicago delayed my flight so I made it after all, but not-so-thankfully, said thunderstorm delayed that flight for another 3 hours, and so I waited yet again.

Waiting can strengthen us, or test us, or sometimes both. And these tests can be dangerous. As I waited for my flight in London, I found myself giving in to the temptation to curse the airline that was making me late for my opening dinner. "Lord, You gave me this trip and this first meal together will make or break this trip, and now this cursed airline has ruined my Sabbatical!" See the escalating size of this inconvenience (for "inconvenience" was all that it truly was)? Waiting can cause us to act selfishly, think dishonestly, and forget our Christlikeness.

As I watched the line of my COVID test appear next to the T, the Mark showing a result ironically called "positive", and I knew my waiting had just begun. And as I waited, I found my tendency to take control in stressful situations rearing up. Trying to control is often a lack of faith, a lack of trust that God is the One truly in control. And waiting can pull that sin to the surface, as it did for me.

And as the extra week of Scotland time passed, I found myself with three new friends in a very comfortable AirBnB just outside Edinburgh. As the quarantine passed and we had days to bus into the city for amazing food, concerts, and sightseeing, another danger reared up: comfort. As much as I wanted to get home, I found myself enjoying this extended stay, and even had flashes where I didn't want it to end. In those moments, I had grown too comfortable and lost sight of what I was waiting for.

As we wait together this Advent, we pray that God will grow us through the tests that waiting brings. May we not lose our ethical compass nor our Christlikeness. May we not forget to let God be in control, even though He waits longer to return than we would wish. May we not lose faith and forget to trust God in all of our circumstances. And may we not rest in our comfort and find ourselves enjoying the wait more than what we are waiting for.

IMMERSE Yourself in God's Word Again

One of our chief ways of knowing God is through the bible, and so every Spring we take part in the Immerse Bible Study together. From Feb. – May, our whole congregation gathers in groups to

read, ask questions about, and discuss one particular section of the bible together. Two years ago, we began in "The Beginning", reading Genesis through Deuteronomy. Last year, we read the Story of Jesus together, from Matthew through Revelation. This year, we will look at the Kingdom of Israel by reading Joshua -2 Kings together.

Our hope and goal is to have 70% of our adult congregation involved in an Immerse Bible Study Group. This means we need 125 of us taking part in a group. Our youth will, and many of our existing small groups will. Our Sunday school class will. But many of us aren't part of any of these groups. So we want to invite and encourage every one of you to be a part of an Immerse Small Group whether online or in person. The agreement is to read about 10 minutes each day (less time than we spend flipping through social media each day!), and then to gather each week with your Immerse Group to discuss what you've read and deepen each other's understanding of it. Our reading begins on Jan. 30, and signup for our groups begin with the new year. Join us on this journey, beginning Jan. 31, and see if your life doesn't change noticeably this year.

In this fast-paced world, we focus this year's theme for the retreat to be about rest. Students name for me often the challenges they face regarding finding rest from their studies, sports, bands, social commitments, and the like. With hopes of listening and responding to this need we put together a weekend where we could learn to rest and experience it as well. Students were invited to recline with God, reach out to God, and simply be with God this weekend. We see in the scriptures Jesus modeling rest often when he would retreat for a while to a solitary place to simply be with God and find rest. Students were brought to a coffee shop to play board games, share some light conversations, and to simply enjoy a cozy place to sit for a while. They also walked leisurely about town finding some chocolate, ice cream, some tasty beef jerky to share, and enjoyed simply being unhurried and enjoying rest. Students enjoyed restful offerings such as a nap, journaling, doodling, and simply listening to the rain.
