He hated the daily 2-mile hike to the river. Every the hut, hooked them to the yoke, and carried them the 2 miles to the river, the nearest drinkable water to the village. It was a long, hard tromp carrying the heavy pots, but it was even worse coming home. 2 pots were heavy – 2 pots full of water were heavier. But it was his job, and it helped the family, so he did it, though begrudgingly.

On a particular day, the sun was beating down and the weather had turned even hotter than usual. His sandal had a stone in it, his brother had mocked him that morning, and his mom was ill. His 2-mile tromp had become a nightmare, and when he arrived at the river, there was a beast drinking so he had to wait until it left. In a fit of anger and frustration, he threw the pots to the ground, and one cracked. It wasn't a large crack, but it wouldn't hold water all the way to the top. He got the water, and cursed his way home with a trickle of water seeping out of the right-hand jar. They couldn't fix it with the materials they had, so he just had to use the cracked jar. Day after day he walked to the river and day after day he trickled his way home.

One day, the village elder sat down next to him at dinner. "How goes the world, young man," said the elder. The boy shared his frustration at himself for cracking the jar and at the jar for being so weak and at the slow, trickling water that tortured him with guilt every day as he walked home. "Sounds like a hard time," said the Elder. "But tomorrow as you walk, rather than focusing on the jar, take a look at the path on which you walk and tell me what you see."

The next day the boy obeyed and saw a curious sight. Along the right-hand side of the path, the ground was bare and dusty. But along the left-hand side of the path, flowers bloomed in an explosion of color. When he reported this to the Elder that night, the Elder just smiled. "The cracked jar that you so quickly discount has a power you didn't see in your frustration. As the water trickles out on your way home, that side of the path is watered while the

other is not. Your cracked pot is creating beauty, life, and health without you even seeing it."

Every one of us is a cracked pot. We have hardships, weaknesses, and scars from our pasts and our presents. But God can use these cracked pots to bring beauty, life, and health to the world around us, if we can just look beyond our cracks and let God's love and grace trickle out of us as we walk this life's path.

Rev. Dr. Danny Martinez will be speaking to our congregation on February 5th.

Reverend Danny Martinez was unanimously elected for a second term as superintendent of the Central Conference of the Evangelical Covenant Church for the ministries found in Indiana, Illinois, Michigan (Upper Peninsula), Eastern Missouri and Wisconsin. He is the first superintendent in our denomination of Latino descent. His parents emigrated from Guatemala to the United States, moving to Chicago, IL.

Danny has served in a number of leadership roles, including worship, youth and lead pastor. He has also been a church planter and served as President of ALIPE (Latino Association of Covenant Churches in the US). Danny moved back to Chicago, IL, from San Diego, CA, in 2017. This was

truly a call from the Lord to leave San Diego!

Pastor Danny is an accomplished musician with several CD's in different genres of music including Latin Pop, Hard Rock, Contemporary Worship and Latin Groove. He recently released an album named "Colores," which is available on all major streaming platforms.

Doctor Martinez is a graduate of C.H.E.T. (The Hispanic Center for Theological Studies, which serves Evangelical churches). He is also a graduate of Fuller Seminary with a Master of Divinity, and a Doctorate in Homiletics.

Danny has a sense of humor. He tells the truth in love, so laughing helps people better receive the message. Since Danny comes from a multicultural church, he really values church participation during sermons and sometimes he makes the congregation dance at no extra cost.

Danny has three children, Eric, Angelique and Alec. His children think he is old.

Like to bake? - Bring a Dessert to Share (you don't have to sign up for this)


Clean-Up Responsibilities:

ON THE FLIP SIDE: A 4-WEEK STUDY FROM THE PROPHETS & GOSPELS ON JUSTICE

SERIES OVERVIEW:

When Jesus was on earth, he wasn't exactly known for telling people what they wanted to hear. Jesus' message was unlike any message people had ever heard before. He didn't give shallow motivational speeches or feelgood sermons. He didn't recycle the same messages other religious leaders were teaching. He flipped people's ideas about God, the world, and themselves completely upside down — usually in uncomfortable ways. And that's always how God's words have worked! In this four-week series, we'll compare Jesus' words in the Gospels with the words of the Old Testament prophets to see how God's words have always challenged our understanding of what's wrong or right, good or bad, and just or unjust. We'll talk about how, both then and now, God flips our assumptions about who God values, our definition of righteousness, our understanding of what's good enough, and our definition of justice.

Step 2: Log into your account, and select **One Life Winter** <u>Retreat #2</u> Full/Partial Weekend. (February 17-20)

Step 3: Two choices are available: Click on Student, click on "Add to Cart" and the name of your church group will appear in a list with other churches attending. Clicking on the church group. There is no payment required to Covenant Point.

Step 4: Review and Submit Application

SKIING & SNOWBOARDING: Spending Sunday skiing or snowboarding at **Ski Brule** is a program option for this retreat for an additional fee. CPBC gets discounted group rates for lift tickets and ski/snowboard rental. **This years' rates are \$50 for pass and rental and \$40 for a pass**. If any of your students plan to go to the ski hill, a chaperone must accompany them and provide transportation and supervision while at the hill. If some students remain at CPBC they also require supervision for an adult leader. As the retreat grows closer, we'll provide ski forms and a system for collecting numbers and payment (which should be paid to your church / youth group). Ski forms and payment are due to CPBC (from youth leaders) during Saturday morning of the retreat.

PAYMENT: Is made either online through LCC giving portal OR by check sent to office. Here are the three costs:

1. Retreat only: \$155

2. Retreat and ski pass: \$190

3. Retreat, ski pass and ski rental: \$205



Senior High Youth Group helping out with Love, Inc. Furniture Ministry

Winter is usually a dark season for many people in Lake County, especially for those who don't have a bed or basic furniture and supplies. Our LCC Sr High youth joined the LCC Love INC furniture ministry team on January 7th to get to know some of our neighbors in Waukegan and to deliver much needed furniture to them. We first met a young couple who had moved to Chicago from Oklahoma and recently moved into a small apartment in Waukegan. Being new to the area, they were looking for a church family with a ministry for people in their early 20s. We were able to connect them with Vertical Encounter Church in Waukegan which is close to their apartment. They told us that making a connection to a church was even more important than the furniture we delivered. Next we met a young woman who was fleeing a domestic violence situation and "starting over" on her own. Angela, Kelly and Grace first met with this woman and introduced the group to her. It was a blessing to have 3 young women who follow Jesus make that first connection, as sometimes it can be difficult to have a group of men coming into an apartment of someone who has dealt with domestic violence. Before we left, this woman became our friend and wanted to have a picture taken with us. She said that our visit had made her day. Participating on the Furniture Ministry team is more than delivering furniture to people. The furniture allows us to come into our neighbors' homes and make a personal connection and pray with them. We welcome anyone to come serve with the LCC Love INC Furniture Ministry team. You don't need to be able to move furniture to participate. This is a great opportunity to be God's eyes, ears and hands and to get to know our neighbors in the Lake County area. The LCC team meets at the Love INC warehouse at 8:00 a.m. on the first Saturday of every month. Please let me (Scott Anderson) know if you are interested in serving.













Scott Anderson and I are so proud of Luke and his friend Haniel, son of our dear friends Grace Gaiya and Zachs-Toro Gaiya, for preaching the word in church, under the careful and loving tutelage of our associate/youth pastor, Paul Couleur.
