The Gift of Lent

We all have seasons in our lives when we find ourselves taking stock of our life. Maybe this is a deeper look at our career choice or current job. Maybe this is about family and the future. Maybe it's about health of

life balance. For me, last summer was a chance to take stock of my spiritual life. Having finished a year of participating in St. Ignatius' Spiritual Exercises and learning new ways to pray, my sabbatical was an opportunity for me to spend significant time with God pondering faith, theology, and life. Much was decided, much more observed and noticed, but it was a turning point for me spiritually.

Lent can be an annual season for all of us to take stock of our spiritual life. In this season of contemplation, confession, repentance, and quiet, we find a gift from God – time to reflect. In our busy, overfilled, stuffed-to-the-gills schedules, this is indeed a gift that is rare and deeply valuable. When else do we take time to sit quietly with God for an extended season? When else are we encouraged to say "No" to overscheduling, to visual and audible and mental noise, to the drone of "progress and success" that so often drowns out the Still Small Voice of God? Lent is a gift given to each of us, if we will simply take it.

But that's the problem, isn't it? Lent offers us time, yet we are so resistant to accepting it. We fear we'll fall behind at work, miss an opportunity with family, or hinder a friendship we'd like to develop if we say yes to this gift of reflective time. And so too often we fall behind in our relationship with God, miss opportunities with Him, and hinder our own spiritual growth instead. Every gift is a choice – to receive it or not – and God's gifts are never forced upon us.

Could you receive this gift this year passing it by? Could you give up your a time each day and take that time to sit assess? Could you, in receiving God's gift year, also give Him the gift of your during Lent? It's a risk, there's no doubt



instead of hectic life for with God and of time this attention about it. You risk missing out on the things of this world. You risk being fully known and in so doing finding acceptance. You risk hearing God speak of next steps and growth in your relationship with Him.

Let me encourage you, as one who has accepted this gift and found it a blessing, to take time each day with God this Lent. Take time to look honestly and truly at your own Spiritual life. Assess your maturity, and enlist help if you need it. Read a book like Thomas Ashbrook's "Mansions of the Heart", take an online spiritual assessment tool (be careful to research good ones first), or find a Spiritual Director (I'm happy to help you find someone). Consider what you need to take the next step along the spiritual journey and then do it.

Lent is a gift of God for each of us, the gift of time with Him. Will you accept it this year?



Lent 2023

As we enter this Lenten season, we want to give you plenty of opportunities to celebrate this church season together as a congregation and as a household, whether that is 8 of us or 1 of us.

<u>Mitzvah Chains</u> – at our Ash Wednesday service, each household created a "Mitzvah Chain" for Lent. "Mitzvah" literally means command in Hebrew, but has taken on the idea of a Good Deed. So our chain is made up of a different idea for each day of Lent, an idea for a good deed, a time of prayer, or a thought to ponder. At a set time when the household is together, you read your chain for the day together and then do what it says. Some require action, some prayer, and some an activity together. Use the Mitzvah Chain to prepare yourself for the holiest day of the Church year, Easter Sunday!

<u>Worship Theme</u> – our theme for Lent this year is "A Table in the Wilderness". We'll be looking at biblical stories of God's provision for people in the wilderness, people like Jesus, David, Elijah, Hagar, the Israelites, and the Disciples. We have a whole lineup of speakers, so join us each week for worship.

<u>Communion</u> – Each week in Lent, we will celebrate God's provision for us in our own wildernesses at the Table of the Lord's Supper. Unlike our usual monthly schedule, through Lent, we will celebrate Communion every week until Holy Week. Each week we will focus on a different image of the Table, and often we will celebrate it in different ways. Come to the Table together this Lent.

<u>Personal Devotion</u> – It is not uncommon for people to give something up or take something on during Lent as a personal devotional practice. If you choose to skip our Immerse reading and our Mitzvah Chain, then let us encourage you to a Lenten fast. You can give up food for a day, or a kind of food for the season. But you can also give up Facebook or social media, TV, complaining, gossip, or coffee. Or you can choose to take on a devotional activity like bible reading, prayer, care for the poor, or almsgiving. Each of us can benefit from our own unique devotion, and God is pleased with our attempts more than our successes, so give it a try this year.

With the advent of Lent this month (see what I did there?) we begin our new theme, "A Table in the Wilderness". For Lent we will focus on God's provision in our wilderness times by looking at stories of people who found God's provision for themselves in the literal wilderness. 






Immerse update

Inspired in part by the historical figure of Sarah Grimke (a feminist, suffragist and, importantly, an abolitionist), Kidd allows herself to go beyond the record to flesh out the inner lives of all the characters, both real and imagined"

FOCUS: A 4-WEEK STUDY FROM THE GOSPELS & PSALMS ON SPIRITUAL GROWTH SERIES OVERVIEW:

It's not easy to stay focused. Especially these days, when we're connected to a never-ending stream of new notifications, ads, messages, videos, posts, and entertainment, it makes sense if we feel a little distracted sometimes. Maybe you've struggled recently to stay focused on your homework, or on the story your friend was telling you, or on the movie you were watching — but have you ever struggled to stay focused when you were spending time with God? In this four-week series, we're going to get honest about how difficult it can be to stay focused when we're trying to pray, read the Bible, or grow in our faith. Each week, we'll explore passages from Psalms and the Gospels as we challenge ourselves to focus on practicing four spiritual disciplines that can help us grow. Together, we'll try focusing on what God has said, on giving something up, on talking to God, and on rest.
