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A Season for Everything

The first church I served was in the vacation community of Cheboygan, MI. As the entrance to the “Inland Waterways”, a stretch of 40 miles of lakes and rivers for boating, tubing, and canoeing, and only 20 miles from Mackinac City and Island, Cheboygan was flooded with tourists (we called them “fudgies” for the Mackinac Island Fudge they all bought) from Memorial Day to Labor Day. The rest of the year, the town felt dead with only about 5000 people. We also had a significant “Snowbird” population, people who summered with us and were involved in the church, but wintered elsewhere.

As pastor, my job was to help them grow in their faith, but pastors cannot grow their faith for them, so we encouraged them to take their own spiritual growth seriously. Yet through the school year, the response was, “There really aren’t many people around right now. When the summer folk come, then we can really step it up.” And when the summer folk came, along with the Fudgies, the response was, “We are so busy with work that we don’t have time. In the fall when the season dies down we’ll have time to really step it up.” This cycle of constantly postponed spiritual growth was habitual for them. And unfortunately, it often is for us as well.

Libertyville is not a vacation spot, but we often have our own excuses for why we are waiting to really step up our spiritual growth. “I’ll wait until my kids grow up; it’s all about them right now.” “Work keeps me so busy, I’ll spend my retirement really growing.” “The pandemic has wiped us out and we don’t have the energy right now.” Travel, work, and lack of resources... it seems the

excuses for slacking on our Spiritual Training are as various as our excuses for slacking on our Physical Training.

Solomon wrote, “There is a season for every activity under the heavens.” I believe the season for working on our spiritual growth comes every day. Yes, rest and self-care are vitally important, but those are not opposite of our spiritual growth – they are a part of it. What if this summer, as you looked for opportunities to rest, you simultaneously stepped up your spiritual growth a bit? What if instead of the fluffy summer read this year, you grabbed a spiritual growth book? We have many suggestions depending on what you’re looking for. What if for the summer, you spent a few hours on a Saturday morning helping move furniture with Love INC? We have light furniture and even jobs for those who can’t lift anything. What if you took the summer and memorized the current directory so you knew everyone in church by name? Or better yet, invite a church family over or out for a meal each week? Or better yet, a neighbor or co-worker and share your life story – especially the Jesus parts – over the meal?

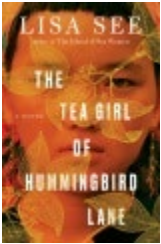

Immerse “Kingdoms” Wrap-up

We have now finished our third Immerse Bible Reading Experience! We began in 2021 with, appropriately, “Beginnings” and read the first five books of the bible together. In 2022, we jumped to the New Testament and read, well, all of it in “Messiah”. Now in 2023, we’ve finished the histories from the Old Testament, “Kingdoms”. And with that, we are half way through reading the whole bible together

as a church. The remaining studies include “Poetry” looking at Job, the Psalms, Proverbs, Ecclesiastes, Lamentations, and Song of Solomon, “Chronicles” looking at Chronicles 1 & 2, Ezra, Nehemiah, Daniel and Esther, and “Prophets” dealing with all of the Major and Minor prophets. Which will we read next year? Stay tuned!

As we reflect back on all we’ve read and studied since we began in February, one thing becomes clear – we desperately need a Savior. Left to our own will, we always tend toward power differentials, war, violence... in a word, sin. We turn away from God in a heartbeat, and need to constantly be wooed back into relationship. Through the violence and evil of our spiritual history, we see over and over again our desperate need for a Savior. And so having read this together, we are even more keenly aware of the power, importance, and gift of grace that is Jesus Christ. All the bloodshed, then and now, is forgiven and redeemed. Our history becomes not a tale of woe but a constant reminder of God’s faithfulness and goodness to us.

I hope you’ve been reading, and coming together in one of our 7 small groups. For this summer, two of those groups continue, though focused on different books – Immerse is just for the Springtime. Children's Ministries



Beginning on May 28, we will be transitioning from a Children's Church model where our children leave us for half of our worship service to an intergenerational model where they stay with us and are actively included in our weekly worship. During the second half of the service, our children will be invited to the PrayGround, an area of the sanctuary designated for them with Shepherds to oversee them and activities to do that will be part of the sermon. We have seen this model at our All-Church Retreats the last few years as well as immediately post-COVID in our own worship services. See letter for more details.



Welcoming our Children Fully into the Worship of the Church

“Let the Little Children come to me and do not hinder them for the Kingdom of God belongs to such as these.” (Mark 19:14)

“Jesus welcomed children into the Kingdom and even went so far as to say we are all to enter the Kingdom as children. But when it comes to worship, children are often not welcomed. Though they occasionally lead us with a children’s choir or process in with palms, these are often the exception. We ‘adjust’ worship to include children. But once these activities are over, so too is the participation of children.

But Jesus says, ‘Let the children come to me and do not hinder them.’ There is no place in scripture where Jesus ever suggests worship should not include the whole body of Christ, including children. Paul makes it clear in 1 Corinthians 13 that the church is a body, and every part is equally important, and those parts we deem to be weaker are indispensable.

Worship isn’t about us. It was never meant to be selfish, but selfless. It’s coming together as a body to glorify God. From the very beginning God knew that tactile kinesthetic elements such as the tabernacle, fire/light, water/cleansing, wind/spirit, bread/body, and wine/blood, would help all generations enter worship. Let’s take a cue from God to include visual and tactile kinesthetic elements as a part of our ongoing worship. Worship that will enable us to grow closer together, and empower children to share their creations, their stories, and their relationship with God within the body of Christ.” - Dr. Steve Burger

Beginning May 28, 2023, while our nursery will continue to function regularly, children in first grade and older are invited to remain in the sanctuary for the entire service. This is a change from our current “Children’s Church” format, where the children leave half-way into our corporate worship time. While there is value in allowing children to worship in their own context, there is also value in worshipping together as the body of Christ.

What will a Sunday morning look like now?

Nursery

- The nursery will be available for newborns through Kindergarten for the entire service.
- Volunteers will be there to provide care for the children. We invite parents to promptly pick up children following worship.
- We are able to live stream the service in our nursery for any parents that may desire to remain with their children.

Entering Worship

- As has been our custom, children may take a Buddy Bag located on the tree at the entrance to the sanctuary. There are a variety of items to engage them during the first half of the service.
- Children will stay with their parents during the first half of the service, but will be engaged in singing, prayer, and other aspects of worship.

Welcome to the PrayGround!

- For the second half of worship, children will be invited to our new PrayGround, an area on the front left side of the sanctuary. Here they will be guided by Shepherds (see below) as they are invited to engage in the sermon, music, and closing activities.
- Children, and any who would like to, may gather here for guided worship expressions using elements such as playdough, crayons, markers, legos, paper, pipe cleaners, etc. Each week there will be different materials and there will be guidance concerning how to use them in worship.
- Children may be invited, should they so choose, to share their creative work as an offering to God.

Shepherds

- Two volunteers will invite and guide children to the PrayGround before the sermon. Of course, this is optional for all.
- These volunteers will wear something that clearly identifies them as Shepherds (a lanyard and identifiable name badge)
- If a child desires to return to their family in the pew during the service, the Shepherd will assist.
- Shepherds and Ushers will guide children should they need to leave the sanctuary during worship for any reason.
- Ongoing training will occur for staff, volunteers, and the congregation to create a safe environment for everyone during worship.

Caring for Children and Families

- Efforts will be made to equip families to discover and engage in worship and mission to extend the love of Christ to others.
- Practical ways to engage children during worship may include: music, visual arts, crafts, media, prayer, scripture reading, storytelling, spiritual practices, dancing, singing, dramas, illustrations children can relate to, ushering, and observing and assisting in communion.
- Children can learn to pray as we do during the worship service:
 - Thanksgiving: Giving thanks to God
 - Listening: resting in God's presence
 - Petition: Asking God to meet needs
 - Intercession: Praying for others
 - Praise: Giving God glory and praising Him
 - Confession: Admitting our sinfulness and receiving the forgiveness of God
 - Commitment: Promising to live our lives for God and share his love and Jesus' story with others

We know that some of you will have concerns about this new approach and we ask that you show patience and grace (with us and the children) as we will surely learn (and improve!) from mistakes made along the way. That said, we welcome feedback about how to improve our efforts to engage our whole congregation together in worship. Evaluation will be regular and ongoing, and will be improved by congregational input. Please contact the pastors or Christian Education and Discipleship Team with any feedback.

Ryan Tanzer is graduating from Libertyville High School and heading to Michigan State to study engineering.

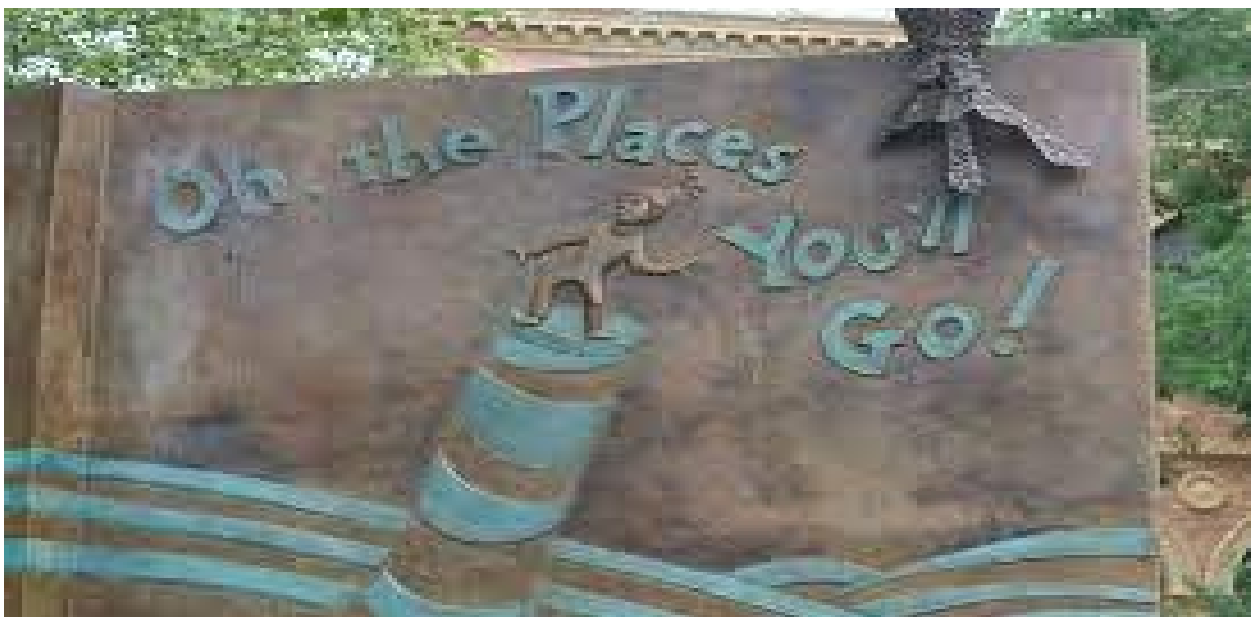
College:
