Growing a Pine Tree Faith

Six years ago, one of you gave me a beautiful Norfolk Island Pine for my office. I gratefully accepted it as a symbol of the growth for which we strive here at Libertyville Covenant Church. And grow it has! But recently, it began to go brown and lose needles or even whole branches. Upon closer inspection, there was another tree growing out of the base, which I thought

made it look fuller. But I decided to prune away that second, small plant to see if I could give more nutrients to the main plant, and sure enough, it is growing strong again. Weekly watering, monthly feeding of the soil, occasional pruning, and plenty of sunlight and my Pine continues to grow tall and strong.

As we begin a new year of ministry, we need to ask ourselves, “how do I hope to grow my faith this year?” We offer myriad opportunities to grow our faith which you can use. But just like my Norfolk Island Pine, it takes work on our part to bring growth to our church and our lives.

“Weekly watering” for our spiritual life includes attending worship. Did you know that sociologists consider a “regular attender” of a church to be someone who attends once each month? This is the common trend, but it is an unhealthy one. Yes, the church will carry on just fine, but our souls need the community and feeding of weekly worship. We need to sing the songs that get stuck in our heads throughout the week, willing us to worship everywhere. We need to pray together in a group so that our individual prayers throughout the week are supplemented and encouraged. We need to hear from God’s Word, from each other, and from the Holy Spirit to find camaraderie in our usually lonely faith walk.

Our “weekly watering” can also come through participation in a Small Group, of which we have 7 right now. Whether it is prayer, study, or discussion you need, weekly attendance at our small groups makes our worship together more potent and our personal faith life more enduring. These include Sunday school, Wed. night gatherings, bible studies, and small groups, all of which would welcome you gladly, for you not only grow in a group, you help the group to grow.

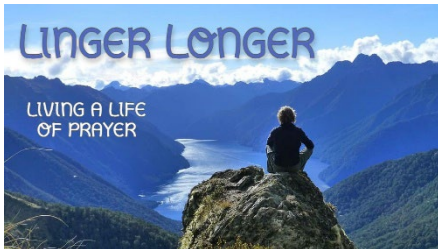
Our “monthly feeding of the soil” comes through our Outreach and Fellowship activities. Just like only taking in food just makes us lazy and large, we need to use the energy we receive to stay healthy and fit. Serve with one of our Mission Partners (Love INC, Jill’s House, PADS, Matthew Homes, Feed My Starving Children) or go on a retreat (Family, women’s, men’s, youth, children, or our Unhurried Retreat). Serve on a Ministry Team at church. Join us for a progressive dinner, a Road Rally, Christmas Caroling, or even a Talent Show to build stronger bonds with our other branches. Feed the soil of our church in which you can grow.

“Occasional pruning”, even of smaller, healthier secondary trees, is also important to make sure you are growing in the right area. Too often other things in our lives grow alongside our spiritual growth, and even those that seem healthy take up our resources, whether this is time, attention, or money, and drain them from our spiritual growth. Pruning the things that aren’t growing us spiritually is one of the most counter-productive but fruitful ways to grow.

“I am the true vine, and my Father is the gardener. 2 He cuts off every branch in me that bears no fruit, while every branch that does bear fruit he prunes so that it will be even more fruitful.” – John 15:1-2

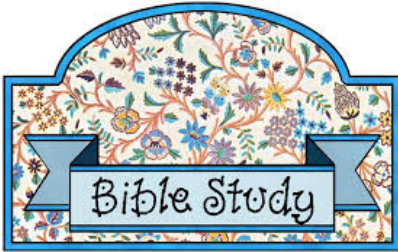

September Worship



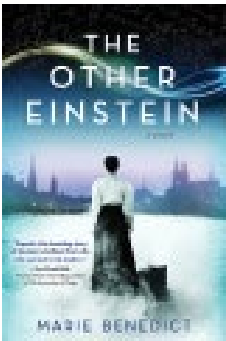

BEYOND BELIEF: A 4-WEEK SERIES FROM EXODUS ON DOUBT & QUESTIONS

The Bible is full of things that seem almost "beyond belief." Sometimes that's because the stories we read on its pages are miraculous — especially the story of Exodus. Like, did God really split a whole sea in half, speak to Moses from a burning bush, or rescue all those people from enslavement? Other times, the Bible says things that sound a little too good to be true — like, is God really as loving, kind, patient, or powerful as Scripture says? And can God really use each of us to do big things in the world? In this four-week series from the book of Exodus, we'll explore what the story of Moses and the Israelites can help us discover about doubt and belief. We'll talk about how, when you doubt yourself, God can still use you. And we'll see how, when you doubt God, it's okay to ask questions because God still offers guidance and always takes care of you.
