Pray Where You Are

A long time ago in what feels like a galaxy far, far away, The Lost Dogs played at the Youth Worker Connection in Chicago. This event specifically for youth pastors came just before the annual MidWinter Conference (and still does!) and was a time of connection and worship as the youth pastors of the Covenant. That year, I fell in love with this group made up of the lead guitarists from a number of different Christian bands. Specifically, two of their songs, "Pray Where You Are" and "Breathe Deep" became anthems for my early youth pastor days and stick with me today.

"In the submarines and tanks, in the S&L's and banks, in the cancer wards, the prisons, and the bars; On the earth and on the moon, in the closet, in your room, in the flophouses, the think-tanks, and the farm; To the salesman forever trying to sell; to the faithful daughter walking to the well – Pray where you are!"

This fall, as we look together at prayer, learning how to pray differently and hopefully more faithfully, we need to take a long, honest look at our prayer lives. While many of us are trying to live more healthy lives through diet or exercise, we can also be living healthier spiritual lives through prayer. And just as we can exercise anywhere, whether sitting at our desk, walking to get more coffee, or at the gym in the morning, so we can pray anywhere, from the car to the dinner table to the hospital. And we can pray WHILE we do the rest of life, whether in a meeting, in front of the TV, or lying in bed. Prayer is everywhere, and everywhen, and yet it can be so hard to pray.

Sometimes that's because we see prayer as a duty, a requirement we must fulfill in order to punch our "good Christian" card for the day instead of a living


conversation with the One who loves us so dearly. When prayer gets dry and rote, it's a good sign that we have begun treating it as a duty.

Sometimes that's because we see prayer as a simple recitation of our current wishlist. It's like sitting on Santa's lap and telling him all we want for Christmas rather than a conversation, full of speaking and listening, with not topic too trivial or too personal. When prayer becomes a recitation, it's a good sign that we have begun treating it as a wishlist.

Sometimes that's because we see prayer as a waste of time that could be spent doing something more productive. We see it as an empty ritual with no real, tangible effect except perhaps a peace we could achieve much quicker with a slow, deep breath. When we stop hearing stories of effective prayer and do not stop to celebrate how prayer has connected us with God recently, it's a good sign that we have become "too busy to pray".

There is no "right" time to pray, regardless of those who tell you that you must get up early to do it. There is no "right" way to pray, for conversation should flow naturally if we are truly aware of the One we are conversing with. And there is no "right" place to pray, as we discussed last week in the sermon. The only wrong way to pray is NOT to pray at all. Because when our prayer life is rich and regular, we find a new mindset growing in us, a new energy for the things of God, and a new wisdom as we approach this world. So Pray Where You Are, when you think of it, as you wish. Just pray, and see what God might have in store for you!


October Worship
