Therefore, since through God's mercy we have this ministry, we do not lose heart. Rather, we have renounced secret and shameful ways; we do not use deception, nor do we distort the word of God. On the contrary, by setting forth the truth plainly we commend ourselves to everyone's conscience in the sight of God. And even if our gospel is veiled, it is veiled to those who are perishing. The god of this age has blinded the minds of unbelievers, so that they cannot see the light of the gospel that displays the glory of Christ, who is the image of God. For what we preach is not ourselves, but Jesus Christ as Lord, and ourselves as your servants for Jesus' sake. For God, who said, "Let light shine out of darkness," made his light shine in our hearts to give us the light of the knowledge of God's glory displayed in the face of Christ. But we have this treasure in jars of clay to show that this all-surpassing power is from God and not from us. We are hard pressed on every side, but not crushed; perplexed, but not in despair; persecuted, but not abandoned; struck down, but not destroyed. – 2 Cor. 4:1-9

"What do we at Libertyville Covenant Church have to offer our community?" This should be the first question any church asks of itself. What gifts, abilities, passions, resources, and people has God given us to share with the community in which we have been planted?

Our first answer, of course, must be, "Jesus Christ." As Paul says in 2 Cor 4, God made the Light of Jesus shine in our hearts, yet placed it in "jars of clay" (that's us) so people wouldn't focus on our greatness but on Jesus. We have the knowledge of God's glory, and this world desperately needs to hear it.

What else? We are a deeply generous church, with amazing financial resources to share with the community around us. Just four months ago, when Heather had hand surgery, our church shared their resources with us to remind us that we weren't alone in that dark time. Whether food, finances, or heart-felt cards and notes, LCC showed one of its great gifts – generosity – to us for which we are eternally grateful. But I've seen us share our resources with camps, community ministries, missionaries, fellow Christians in need, and complete strangers.

What else? We have a long history of strong relationships with each other. This is harder, because those relationships get so tight that the community


around us can see it as a closed circle instead of a welcoming relational invitation. 10 years ago when I candidated here, I had people come up and form a circle, and of course we formed it facing inward. I warned us then that this could be a problem, unless we hold our relationships both inward AND outward facing. And we have on occasion reached out not to help but to welcome. New Abbey has become a very important part of our relationships at LCC, a community that didn't exist when I first started serving here. God has blessed us with an innate sense of relationship and then called us to use it to reach out with it, not just in.

What else? A loyalty to our church, a denominational presence, strong leaders, good children and youth ministries, multiple small groups... God has blessed us with so very much, not so that we could become a megachurch or make a name for ourselves. God has blessed us to bless the community around us.

So rather than asking how we can pull the community in to LCC so we can have more children, more young families, more volunteers, more leaders, more offerings, more, more, more... what if instead every conversation we had at coffee hour asked the question, "What do we at Libertyville Covenant Church have to offer our community?"

In the words of 2 Corinthians, don't lose heart, people of God. We have a ministry, given to us by God, and we are doing it with integrity. Not everyone will join us, and in today's culture, that number may be fewer than ever because society, busyness, and cynicism is blinding them to the good news we have to share about Jesus. But keep offering yourselves in ministry to those OUTSIDE the church; keep offering them Jesus rather than seeing what we can get from them, and though we face hard times and hardships, we will not be defeated in Jesus Christ our Lord.

# November Worship





#### All Church Congregational Meeting, Nov. 5th


