We Americans are an isolated people. We live alone in huge houses, we work alone in tiny cubicles, we drive alone, we sometimes eat alone, and we do our Social Media, ironically, alone. As the world has shifted and those huge houses become harder to buy, and we work from home, and we don't drive as much as we used to, we still find ways to be alone. We are unique in history in that we have to pay people (therapists, spiritual directors, pastors) just to listen to us, a role that used to be taken up by friends and family. We sit next to people on a couch, both looking at different screens, and ultimately alone. We are an isolated people.

And it's not just our physical selves, or even our psychological selves that are alone. Our opinions are held alone, so much so that we have to force ourselves to reinforce them by only listening to those who hold the same opinions. We go to churches only as long as we agree with them, join chatrooms, read news sources, friend and unfriend people on social media, all based on whether they reinforce our opinions. And so we maintain our "us vs. them" mentalities, our black and white thinking, as we sit in our echochambers and hear only our own opinions spoken back to us.

And the most devastating result of doing life alone is that we stunt our own growth. You see, what we need to grow is new ideas. Not to swallow hook, line, and sinker (google this fish metaphor and you'll see what I mean), but to hear and ponder. When we hear things we already know and already agree with, we don't grow at all. Only when we brush up against something new, something unfamiliar, something unwelcomed even, can we grow.

I've been challenged on this recently through the Antiracism Discipleship Pathway that the Covenant created and that I have been part of since last fall. "Look at your podcasts, preachers, music, and books. How many are from people different than you? of other ethnicities? Other genders?" As I pondered this, I realized that all of the ideas I was hearing and pondering came from people just like me; white American males who wrote, sang, discussed, and taught things I generally already knew. I've been working on it, first in ethnicity, and soon in gender, but I'm a far way off of 'well rounded'.

And so we come to our theology. We in the Covenant do theology in community, because only there will we bump up against new ideas, ideas we haven't had or heard, and maybe some we disagree with. And only there, in the new, can we grow. Only there can we learn to discern God's voice from our own, or societies, or our parents, or those in our echo-chamber lives.

Starting this month, we have 2 great opportunities to grow, to do theology in community, and my prayer is that we will all join in to these conversations. The first is our Immerse study, which you can read about later in this newsletter. The second is our Covenant Conversations Sunday school class, which is also described in the following pages.

Whether you join an Immerse small group, come to Sunday school, or just have regular conversations with someone different than you, we need to hear lots of ideas from lots of sources in order to grow. Some of those ideas we need to dismiss (and more importantly we need to know <u>why</u> to dismiss them), some we will naturally agree with (again, we need to know why), and some we need to hold loosely and ponder for a while. But only when we do our theology in community can we truly grow into the people God created us to be.

February Worship



February begins our annual Immerse Program, and this year we will once again be preaching through Immerse as we read it together. (For the full Immerse program detail, see later in this newsletter.) Each Sunday we will look at a passage from the Prophets that we will read together in the coming week. These sermons are meant to prepare you for both your individual reading and your community small-group discussion. They will be more impactful for those fully immersed in the reading and small groups.

For Lent, however, we will focus elsewhere. We will look at the life of the Apostle Peter and his Wandering Heart during Lent. Through the words of the hymn, "Come Thou Fount of Every Blessing", we will explore Peter's story of the cross and empty tomb and see how ours might parallel his.

Covenant Conversations Sundays 9am at LCC

Covenanters have always gathered around Scripture, prayer and authentic conversation in community. This winter and spring, we will engage in a series of conversations around various concepts and topics. One of the joys of our Covenant tradition is a deep commitment to Scripture, and to authentic engagement around the text in community--even when we don't agree. We celebrate the ways in which we have been able to do this at LCC!

As the broader denomination also enters into conversation around a range of issues, many felt the need to better define our Covenant ideals and responsibilities to each other. At the Covenant annual meeting this summer (2024), a vote will be taken on a "Resource Paper" introduced last year (in draft form) entitled FREEDOM, UNITY, AND RESPONSIBILITY IN COVENANT LIFE AND MISSION.

Resource papers have long been used as wonderful, Scripture-grounded teaching tools to spur discussion, and to seek the discernment of congregations across the county. Over the last few weeks, we have read this draft resource paper, and shared in conversation around core dimensions of our own Covenant tradition.

In the weeks ahead, we'll be continuing our conversations around other aspects of our Covenant identity, beginning with the core questions that help us live together as a Covenant people.

We are open to suggestions of topics to converse about, and will have more topics of our own to discuss in the following months.

This conversation is for anyone who wants to have a discussion about what it means to be a Covenanter today. So come and join us every Sunday at 9am.

Immerse: Prophets Kickoff Feb. 4

Have you ever read the prophets of the Old Testament before? Few have, yet we get many of our most wellknown and influential verses from these writers, verses like, "What does the Lord require of us? Do justice, love mercy, and walk humbly with your God", and "'For I know the plans I have for you,' declares the Lord. 'Plans to prosper you and not to harm you.'" These along with so many of our favorite Christmas verses and music all come from the Prophets, yet without the context around these verses, we risk misreading and misusing them in our lives.

That's why this year, like very spring, we gather as a church to read through this portion of our scriptures together. Immerse is the Bible, with all the numbers we've added (like chapter and verse divisions) removed so it reads more like the original story, song, or prophecy. Each weekday we commit to reading for 10-15 minutes, and then each week we gather with others from church for an hour to talk about what we've read and share our insights, questions, and ponderings. Reading and small groups carry us through May 24.

Food is still needed to feed them daily. 1st Presbyterian Church in Libertyville has been receiving donations every Wednesday evening. Volunteers sort the donated items by category and then deliver them to one of the 5 hotels.

Early in March, LCC members will be receiving a list of needed food items. Once collected, our <u>strong</u> youth will pack them up, deliver them to 1st Presbyterian, help sort and box them and deliver them to the site that most needs them that week.

The Bible repeatedly tells us that it is our responsibility to care for the poor. Our church has always generously followed that mandate. The need continues.

RHYTHM: A 4-Week Series from 1 & 2 Corinthians on Spiritual Growth.

SERIES OVERVIEW:

For a lot of us, music is a central part of our lives. In the car, at school, or walking through a store, music gives us a steady rhythm that plays in the background. But the predictable beats and patterns of our favorite songs can do more than just entertain or inspire us — they can teach us something about growing closer to Jesus, too. While growing in our faith can sometimes feel difficult to measure, the right rhythms can help us keep moving in the right direction. In this four-week series, we'll explore passages of Scripture from the Gospels, epistles, and Psalms that help us develop spiritual rhythms that help us grow. Together, we'll be challenged to create more predictable patterns in four key ways: by creating rhythms for spending time with God, using our gifts, sharing our stories, and spending time with others.

Winter camp at Covenant Harbor delivered yet again in amazing ways this weekend. Twelve students and three leaders engaged in a weekend encountering God while being invited to take meaningful next steps of faith. The theme for the weekend was movement and our speaker for the weekend was Pastor Jeff Root. Pastor Jeff charged us to wonder with God how we might be moved closer to God in profound ways.

Every day, we had the opportunity to meet and experience the living God. As we read in the Bible, we saw countless stories of how God is a living and moving God, one full of making ways and stirring up miracles. This winter season, we dove into the stories of the extraordinary life of Jesus, and how He came to live up close and personal with us.

Jesus' life is one of incredible moments, of movement. The story of how Jesus turned on ordinary morning on the job fishing into an extraordinary catch. The story of how Jesus again turned an ordinary meal made for two into an extraordinary abundant feeding of the thousands. Most importantly, the story of Jesus moving out of the grave and into a resurrected life!

Jesus came down to earth, walked along ordinary people moments, but turned everything into an extraordinary life with Him. At Winter Camp, we looked at each one of these encounters with Jesus and saw how Jesus moved in close to us and moved in incredible ways to see how lives are changed by even just one encounter with the living moving resurrected Lord.

Some students having heard the gospel invitation for the first took their first steps towards God. Other students renewed commitments to more boldly proclaim their faith with friends while others agreed to grow in personal connections with God. I would like to invite you to follow up with these students asking them about their weekend. What might they have learned about God or what stood out to them? How might God be inviting them to give themselves more fully to God. God used the gifts a young boy brought, fishes and loaves, and multiplied them for his purposes. God is growing the church, making disciples, and blessing the world through

each and every gift. Thank you for encouraging out youth and the ministry of the church. God is doing great things. Let's keep fanning the flames of faith in this young people day after day.

ONE LIFE RETREAT: February 16th thru Monday, February 19th. By now everyone has registered and we are looking forward to a wonderful weekend together. Please make sure that your payment is in to either the office, if paying by check or on-line by credit card. In both cases, put One Life in the memo portion. Cost per student is \$165. If skiing is an option for your student, the cost will be \$40 ski pass only (student bring own equipment), OR \$50 for pass and rental.

SKIING & SNOWBOARDING: Spending Sunday skiing or snowboarding at <u>Ski Brule</u> is a program option for this retreat for an additional fee. CPBC gets discounted group rates for lift tickets and ski/snowboard rental. See this year's ski rates above. Helmets are required by One Life policy and come with rental equipment. A rental/release ski form will be sent out prior to the retreat weekend and must be filled out by a parent or guardian. If any of your students plan to go to the ski hill, a chaperone must accompany them and provide transportation and supervision while at the hill. If some students remain at CPBC they also require supervision for an adult leader. Ski/Snowboard Rental Form and Waiver – <u>All skiers and snowboarders should fill out</u> <u>the form prior to coming</u>. We'll collect them on Saturday morning and the Ski Brule option will take place on Sunday. Ski forms and payment are due to CPBC (from youth leaders) during Saturday morning of the retreat.
