#### **Intend Blessing**

For decades I've been getting the getting the periodical *Pietisten*. While not a Covenant publication, *Pietisten* is thoroughly Pietist and draws much of its identity from the Evangelical Covenant Church, including its authors, mood, and staff. I have friends who write for and others who lead this endeavor. And while I don't always agree with everything written, I read every issue cover to cover. In fact, the fact that I DON'T

agree with everything is one thing that brings me back issue after issue.

The first of *Pietisten's* stated Premises is simple: "To intend blessing". This simple three-word statement sums up the magazine's purpose – to intend blessing for all who read it. This also sums up the call to the Christian living in this world – to intend blessing for everyone with whom we have contact. In fact, this was one of the first stated purposes God gave as He created a people for Himself in Gen. 12:3, "I will bless those who bless you and whoever curses you I will curse; **and all people on earth with be blessed through you**." As God's people today, we are to intend blessing for "all people on earth".

Sadly, I don't see this in God's people today. Oh, perhaps individually we intend blessing for our family, our friends, and maybe our church. But all people on earth? I'm not seeing it. I see a lot of Christians allowing their political views to trump their identities as Children of God. I see a lot of congregations seeking to lure people into joining them primarily for what they can bring to the congregation rather than how the congregation can bless them. I see denominations at war with themselves because they don't trust each other. And I continue to see people cursing others, mocking others, hurting others, and too often in the name of God. I'm not seeing a lot of intended blessing.

This year promises to be more of the same, but with the heat turned up to 11. This year's presidential battle is going to increase the volume, the pressure, and the loss of faith in each other as well as God. So this year is the year when we as Christians can change the world. When everyone else is trying to tear the "other side" down, whether that is political, theological, or interpersonal, we can be different by intending blessing in all we do, say, and post. When the darkness grows as it promises to this year, the light of Christ has the opportunity to shine even brighter.

What would it look like for every one of us to make a pact that this year, no matter what, we will intend blessing in every relationship, every word spoken

or written, and every assumption we make? What if we were to hold each other accountable to intend blessing? What if we stopped before we spoke or posted or made a decision and asked, "Do I intend blessing for all people on earth through this, or am I just angry, or trying to prove I'm right, or just trying to bless my own side?"

Imagine a 2024 where blessing spread from LCC out into this community and from there out into the world. Imagine if we stopped arguments rather than joining them, responded with gentleness and love in our conversations rather than mockery and anger, and shared the love of Jesus not as a stake in the ground marking Our Side, but as an offer of blessing to the world around us. Imagine people asking what's going on with you because you've changed this year, and then you have the chance to tell them about Jesus and how He intended blessing in everything He did.

What might your world be like if you did the hard work in 2024 of Intending Blessing?

This is a great opportunity to invite your friends, family, and neighbors to join us in making sure that no child goes hungry and also hears the good news of Jesus.

The team wants to share a 2-minute video with you about a little 19-month-old girl in Uganda who was malnourished. She was being cared for by her great-grandmother, who hadn't even named her because she expected the child to die. Instead, she got food packed by FMSC volunteers paid for by FMSC donors. At the end of the video, you can see what only two months of food, one-half box of manna packs, did for this child. She now has a name: Jascent. 



BENEATH THE SURFACE: A 4-Week Series from the Gospels on Identity.

#### **SERIES OVERVIEW:**

Who do you think you are? You might define your identity by the things people see on the surface — like your style, your look, your abilities, or your reputation. Those things might have something to do with who you are, but they don't quite capture the whole picture, do they? For each of us, there is always so much more to who we are beneath the surface. But who are we, really? How can we discover who God made us to be? And how can following Jesus shape who we're becoming? In this four-week series, we'll look at four moments from the early years of Jesus' life. As we do, we'll see how God helps us discover who we're becoming and how God's words help us discover who we are. We'll also learn how the right relationships help us discover how to grow and how Jesus helps us discover purpose.

- Go to Covenant Point's online registration at <u>cpbc.campbrainregistration.com</u>.
- Be sure they know to Choose One Life 2024 session #2, February 16 19 and Libertyville Covenant Church
- Cost per student is \$165. If skiing is an option for your student, the cost will be \$40 ski pass only (student bring own equipment), OR \$50 for pass and rental. Payment will be made directly to LCC via check or online. Continue all the way to the screen that's "Step 5: Review..." where you'll hit the blue "Submit application" button to finish
- Online registration must be completed before January 16<sup>th</sup>.

**SKIING & SNOWBOARDING**: Spending Sunday skiing or snowboarding at <u>Ski Brule</u> is a program option for this retreat for an additional fee. CPBC gets discounted group rates for lift tickets and ski/snowboard rental. See this year's ski rates above. Helmets are required by One Life policy and come with rental equipment. A rental/release ski form will be sent out prior to the retreat weekend and must be filled out by a parent or guardian. If any of your students plan to go to the ski hill, a chaperone must accompany them and provide transportation and supervision while at the hill. If some students remain at CPBC they also require supervision for an adult leader. <u>Ski/Snowboard Rental Form and Waiver – All skiers and snowboarders should fill out</u> <u>the form prior to coming</u>. We'll collect them on Saturday morning and the Ski Brule option will take place on Sunday. Ski forms and payment are due to CPBC (from youth leaders) during Saturday morning of the retreat.
