Loved, Cared for, Redeemed

Last month in our Immerse readings, we read the book of Hosea. This Minor Prophet was commanded by God to marry a prostitute named Gomer, whose unfaithfulness to Hosea would mirror Israel's unfaithfulness to God. She would run off with another man just as Israel had run off with other gods, idols they worshiped instead of God. Yet when her world fell apart due to her unfaithfulness, Hosea was commanded to ransom her from the men she ran away with and to make her once again his wife, to love her and care for her again. This was God's promise to His people that, when their worlds fall apart due to their own unfaithfulness, when they were exiled to foreign and hostile lands, God would ransom them and bring them back to their land and to Him, to be loved and cared for; to be redeemed. But the people did not listen to God's warning and promise through Hosea.

Some 750 years later, after God's people had been under the oppression of countless empires from Assyria to Babylon to Egypt to Rome, God once again spoke to His people, but this time not through a prophet. God came and spoke to them Himself through Jesus. He showed them His ways, taught them, demonstrated a life of worship and praise and love and welcome, and called them to follow Him once again. And when the people wandered off to follow other idols, to seek other treasures than God, He promised once again to ransom them and to bring them back to Him to be loved and cared for; to be redeemed. And when Jesus was arrested, tried, and crucified, God Himself hung on a cross, He did it to show us what it means to be loved – so much so that God Himself would die for us. He did it to show us what it means to be cared for – so much so that God continues our caring relationship forever. He did it to show us what it meant to be redeemed – that Jesus would pay the ultimate price, giving His very life, for us so that we don't have to pay that ultimate price for our own sin.

Some 3 days later, when Jesus rose from the dead, He defeated death once and for all, for all of us. Now as followers of Jesus Christ, we live lives where we are loved, cared for, and redeemed, forever. And in thanksgiving for this, we can live lives where we love, care for, and proclaim God's redemption to those around us.

Notice what Gomer the prostitute had to do in order to be redeemed by Hosea. Notice what God commands us to do in order to be redeemed by Him. This Lenten season, when we are talking with people whose lives have fallen apart, let our message be one of the free grace given us by God, redemption without cost, and then let gratitude lead us to lives of worship, love, and justice.

As we continue our Lenten journey together, we look at the life of the Apostle Peter and his Wandering Heart. Through the words of the hymn, "Come Thou Fount of Every Blessing", we will explore Peter's story of his discipleship journey, which took him from his fisherman nets to Jesus' side, to the cross and on to the empty tomb. How do our wandering hearts identify with Peter's?

Our Holy Week remembrances will begin with Palm Sunday, continue on Good

Friday as we join with our fellow Lake County Covenant churches, and finally lead us to the empty tomb on Resurrection Sunday.

JUSTIFIED: A 4-Week Series from the New Testament on Anger.

SERIES OVERVIEW:

Anger is such a big, powerful emotion. When we're angry about things that matter, our anger can lead us toward action. Anger can even inspire us to make the world a better place! But other times, our anger can lead us to make choices that are harmful to ourselves or others. There are no escaping situations or people who make us angry, but how we respond when we're angry is up to us. So, if we can't completely avoid getting angry, what can we do? In this four-week series, we'll explore four passages of Scripture from both the Old and New Testaments that might challenge our view on anger. We'll learn practical skills like when we feel angry, pause to ask God why. We'll see how, when we're angry, Jesus shows us how to respond. And in our anger, we'll be challenged to show grace and not get hurtful.
